## Statement by the Press Secretary/Director-General for Public Information and Cultural Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan, on the return of Mr. Yasser Arafat, Chairman of the Palestine Liberation Organization, to the Gaza Strip

The Government of Japan expresses its hearty congratulations to Mr. Yasser Arafat, Chairman of the Palestine Liberation Organization, on his permanent return to the Gaza Strip on 12 July 1994. It expects that this marks the first step towards setting the interim self-government on the right track.

The Government of Japan recognizes that financial assistance from the international community is necessary as the interim self-government is being formed, and has pledged that it would allocate for start-up costs US\$ 25.75 million from the US\$ 200 million in assistance for Palestinians to be extended over two years that Japan announced in September last year. Of the pledged amount, \$16.75 million has already been forwarded to the United Nations Development Programme and the World Bank. In addition, the Government of Japan has recently decided to donate 9,000 police uniforms to the Palestinian police.

The Government of Japan hopes that the Palestinian Authority will establish an effective tax collecting system at an early stage to cover the costs of operations of the interim self-government.
