Report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda (S/1995/1002)

The President (*interpretation from Russian*): The Security Council will now begin its consideration of the item on its agenda.

The Security Council is meeting in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations.

Members of the Council have before them the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda, document S/1995/1002. Members of the Council also have before them document S/1995/1019, which contains the text of a draft resolution prepared in the course of the Council's prior consultations.

I should like to draw the attention of the members of the Council to the following other documents: S/1995/1001, letter dated 30 November 1995 from the Permanent Representative of Rwanda to the United Nations addressed to the President of the Security Council; and

S/1995/1018, letter dated 8 December 1995 from the Permanent Representative of Rwanda to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General, transmitting the texts of two letters dated 13 August and 24 November 1995, respectively, from the Minister for Foreign Affairs of Rwanda addressed to the Secretary-General.

It is my understanding that the Council is ready to proceed to vote on the draft resolution in document S/1995/1019. Unless I hear any objection, I shall put the draft resolution to the vote now.

There being no objection, it is so decided.

A vote was taken by show of hands.

In favour:

Argentina, Botswana, China, Czech Republic, France, Germany, Honduras, Indonesia, Italy, Nigeria, Oman, Russian Federation, Rwanda, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United States of America

The President (*interpretation from Russian*): There were 15 votes in favour. The draft resolution has been adopted unanimously as resolution 1028 (1995).

The Security Council has thus concluded the present stage of its consideration of the item on its agenda.
