NOTE BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

At the 94th plenary meeting of its thirty-fifth session, on 12 December 1980, the General Assembly adopted resolutions 35/146 A and B, entitled "Implementation of the Declaration on the Denuclearization of Africa".*

In paragraphs 5 and 7 of resolution 35/146 A, the General Assembly

"5. <u>Requests</u> the Security Council to prohibit all forms of co-operation and collaboration with the racist régime of South Africa in the nuclear field;

"...

"7. <u>Requests</u> the Security Council to institute effective enforcement action against the racist régime of South Africa, so as to prevent it from endangering international peace and security through its acquisition of nuclear weapons".

In paragraph 5 of resolution 35/146 B, the General Assembly

"<u>Requests</u> the Security Council, in keeping with the recommendation of its committee established by resolution 421 (1977) concerning the question of South Africa, to prohibit all forms of co-operation and collaboration with the racist régime of South Africa in the nuclear field".
