LETTER DATED 19 AUGUST 1994 FROM THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to refer to Security Council resolution 872 (1993) of 5 October 1993, by which the Council decided to establish the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda (UNAMIR), and to resolution 918 (1994) of 17 May 1994, by which it authorized the expansion of the Mission.

Further to my letter of 9 August (S/1994/965) and on the basis of additional consultations, I propose that Chad, the Congo, the Niger and Senegal be added to the list of countries contributing troops to UNAMIR. Upon the withdrawal of the multinational operation set up in accordance with Security Council resolution 929 (1994), the contingents of those countries and of Guinea-Bissau will be formally transferred to UNAMIR and come under its command.

I should be grateful if you would bring this matter to the attention of the members of the Security Council.
