## **NOTE**

Symbols of United Nations documents are composed of capital letters combined with figures. Mention of such a symbol indicates a reference to a United Nations document.

The resolutions and decisions of the General Assembly are identified as follows:

### **Regular sessions**

Until the thirtieth regular session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed by a roman numeral in parentheses indicating the session (for example: resolution 3363 (XXX)). When several resolutions were adopted under the same number, each of them was identified by a capital letter placed between the two numerals (for example: resolution 3367 A (XXX), resolutions 3411 A and B (XXX), resolutions 3419 A to D (XXX)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the thirty-first session, as part of the new system adopted for symbols of General Assembly documents, resolutions and decisions have been identified by an arabic numeral, indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution 31/1, decision 31/301). When several resolutions or decisions were adopted under the same number, each of them has been identified by a capital letter placed after the two numerals (for example: resolution 31/16 A, resolutions 31/16 A and B, decisions 31/406 A to I).

### **Special sessions**

Until the seventh special session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed, in parentheses, by the letter "S" and a roman numeral indicating the session (for example: resolution 3362 (S-VII)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the eighth special session, resolutions and decisions have been identified by the letter "S" and an arabic numeral indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution S-8/1, decision S-8/11).

### **Emergency special sessions**

Until the fifth emergency special session, the resolutions of the General Assembly were identified by an arabic numeral followed, in parentheses, by the letters "ES" and a roman numeral indicating the session (for example: resolution 2252 (ES-V)). The decisions were not numbered.

Since the sixth emergency special session, resolutions and decisions have been identified by the letters "ES" and an arabic numeral indicating the session, followed by an oblique stroke and another arabic numeral (for example: resolution ES-6/1, decision ES-6/11).

In each of the series described above, the numbering follows the order of adoption.

The present volume contains the resolutions and decisions adopted by the General Assembly between 22 December 1988, the date of the suspension of the forty-third session of the Assembly, and 18 September 1989, the closing date of the session.

**43/233. Question of Palestine**

*The General Assembly,*

*Having considered* the item entitled "Question of Palestine",

*Guided* by the principles of the Charter of the United Nations and the provisions of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights,<sup>1</sup>

*Gravely concerned at and alarmed* by the deteriorating situation in the Palestinian territory occupied by Israel since 1967, including Jerusalem,

*Expressing its profound shock* at the latest action of members of the Israeli armed forces on 13 April 1989, which resulted in the killing and wounding of Palestinian civilians in the town of Nahalin,

*Having considered* the statement of the Secretary-General on 13 April 1989 relative to that raid,

*Aware* that Israel, the occupying Power, has imposed limitations on Palestinian Muslims that restrict their participation in the life of their community and in the observance of their religious rites and obligations,

*Taking into account* the need to consider means for the impartial protection of the Palestinian civilian population under Israeli occupation,

*Considering* that the current policies and practices of Israel, the occupying Power, in the occupied Palestinian territory are bound to have grave consequences for the endeavours to achieve a comprehensive, just and lasting peace in the Middle East,

*Reaffirming once again* that the Geneva Convention Relative to the Protection of Civilian Persons in Time of War, of 12 August 1949,<sup>2</sup> is applicable to the Palestinian and

other Arab territories occupied by Israel, including Jerusalem,

1. *Condemns* those policies and practices of Israel, the occupying Power, which violate the human rights of the Palestinian people in the occupied territory, including the right of freedom of worship, and, in particular, the opening of fire by Israeli armed forces, which has resulted in the killing and wounding of defenceless Palestinian civilians, and specifically the latest action of members of the Israeli armed forces against the defenceless civilians in the Palestinian town of Nahalin;

2. *Demands* that Israel, the occupying Power, abide scrupulously by the Geneva Convention Relative to the Protection of Civilian Persons in Time of War, of 12 August 1949, and that it desist immediately from those policies and practices which are in violation of the provisions of the Convention;

3. *Requests* the Security Council to consider with urgency the situation in the occupied Palestinian territory with a view to considering measures needed to provide international protection to the Palestinian civilians in the Palestinian territory occupied by Israel since 1967, including Jerusalem;

4. *Stresses* the urgent need to expedite the convening of the International Peace Conference on the Middle East, under the auspices of the United Nations and in conformity with the provisions of General Assembly resolution 43/176 of 15 December 1988;

5. *Requests* the Secretary-General to submit periodic reports on developments in the occupied Palestinian territory.

**43/231. Financing of the United Nations Angola Verification Mission**

*The General Assembly,*

*Having considered* the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of the United Nations Angola Verification Mission<sup>3</sup> and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,<sup>4</sup>

*Bearing in mind* Security Council resolution 626 (1988) of 20 December 1988, by which the Council established the United Nations Angola Verification Mission for a period of thirty-one months,

*Recognizing* that the costs of the United Nations Angola Verification Mission are expenses of the Organization to be borne by Member States in accordance with Article 17, paragraph 2, of the Charter of the United Nations,

*Mindful* of the fact that it is essential to provide the United Nations Angola Verification Mission with the necessary financial resources to enable it to fulfil its responsibilities under the relevant resolution of the Security Council,

*Urging* all Member States to make every possible effort to ensure payment of their assessed contributions to the United Nations Angola Verification Mission in full and on time,

*Taking into account* the nature and the mandate of the United Nations Angola Verification Mission,

*Recognizing* that in order to meet the expenditures caused by the United Nations Angola Verification Mission, a different procedure from the one applied to meet expenditures of the regular budget of the United Nations is required,

*Taking into account* the fact that the economically more developed countries are in a position to make relatively larger contributions and that the economically less developed countries have a relatively limited capacity to contribute towards such an operation,

*Bearing in mind* the special responsibilities of the States permanent members of the Security Council, as indicated in General Assembly resolution 1874 (S-IV) of 27 June 1963, in the financing of the United Nations Angola Verification Mission,

1. *Decides* to appropriate an amount of 9,193,000 United States dollars, inclusive of the amount of 4.2 million dollars authorized with the concurrence of the Advisory

Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, under the terms of General Assembly resolution 42/227 of 21 December 1987, for the operation of the United Nations Angola Verification Mission for an initial period of twelve months, from 3 January 1989 to 2 January 1990, of the mandate period of thirty-one months authorized by the Security Council, and requests the Secretary-General to establish a special account for the Mission;

2. *Decides*, as an *ad hoc* arrangement, to apportion:

(a) An amount of 5,303,438 dollars for the above-mentioned initial period among the States permanent members of the Security Council in the proportions determined by the scale of assessments for the years 1989, 1990 and 1991;<sup>5</sup>

(b) An amount of 3,646,863 dollars for the above-mentioned initial period among the economically developed Member States that are not permanent members of the Security Council in the proportions determined by the scale of assessments for the years 1989, 1990 and 1991;

(c) An amount of 238,283 dollars for the above-mentioned initial period among the economically less developed Member States in the proportions determined by the scale of assessments for the years 1989, 1990 and 1991;

(d) An amount of 4,416 dollars for the above-mentioned initial period to the following of the economically less developed Member States in the proportions determined by the scale of assessments for the years 1989, 1990 and 1991: Afghanistan, Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Bangladesh, Belize, Benin, Bhutan, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cape Verde, Chad, Comoros, Democratic Yemen, Djibouti, Dominica, Ethiopia, Grenada, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Haiti, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Lesotho, Malawi, Maldives, Mali, Mozambique, Nepal, Niger, Papua New Guinea, Rwanda, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Samoa, Sao Tome and Principe, Senegal, Seychelles, Solomon Islands, Somalia, Sudan, Suriname, Uganda, United Republic of Tanzania, Vanuatu, Yemen and Zimbabwe;

3. *Decides* that, for the purpose of the present resolution, the term "economically less developed Member States" in paragraph 2 (c) above shall mean all Member States except Australia, Austria, Belgium, the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Canada, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, Finland, the German Democratic Republic, Germany, Federal Republic of, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Japan,

Luxembourg, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Poland, South Africa, Sweden, the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic and the Member States referred to in paragraphs 2 (a) and (d) above;

4. *Decides* that, in accordance with the provisions of its resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1955, there shall be set off against the apportionment among Member States, as provided for in paragraph 2 above, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund of the estimated staff assessment income of 231,000 dollars approved for the above-mentioned initial period;

5. *Invites* voluntary contributions to the United Nations Angola Verification Mission both in cash and in the form of services and supplies acceptable to the Secretary-General, to be administered, as appropriate, in accordance with the procedure established by the General Assembly in section II of its resolution 43/230 of 21 December 1988;

6. *Requests* the Secretary-General to take all necessary action to ensure that the United Nations Angola Verification Mission is administered with the maximum of efficiency and economy bearing in mind the relevant observations contained in the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions;<sup>6</sup>

7. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-fourth session the item entitled "Financing of the United Nations Angola Verification Mission".

#### 43/232. Financing of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group

##### *The General Assembly,*

*Reaffirming* the direct and legal responsibility of the United Nations for Namibia until independence, as indicated in its resolution 2145 (XXI) of 27 October 1966 and its subsequent relevant resolutions on the question of Namibia,

*Bearing in mind* Security Council resolution 435 (1978) of 29 September 1978, by which the Council established the United Nations Transition Assistance Group for a period of up to twelve months, as well as Council resolutions 629 (1989) of 16 January 1989 and 632 (1989) of 16 February 1989,

*Having considered* the report of the Secretary-General on the financing of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group<sup>6</sup> and the related report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,<sup>7</sup>

*Noting*, as indicated in paragraph 5 of the explanatory statement of the Secretary-General of 9 February 1989<sup>8</sup> approved by the Security Council in its resolution 632 (1989), that the mandate of the military component of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group, as approved by the Council in its resolution 435 (1978), remains unchanged,

*Considering* that, in the light of paragraphs 11 and 14 of the report of the Secretary-General<sup>6</sup> and of the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions,<sup>7</sup> in particular paragraphs 6, 8, 9 and 42 of that report, and taking into account that the number of troops to be deployed initially would be 4,650 all ranks while at the

same time the figure of 7,500 would be maintained as the upper limit," additional resources may be required for the implementation of Security Council resolution 435 (1978) in its original and definitive form,

*Recognizing* that the costs of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group are expenses of the Organization to be borne by Member States in accordance with Article 17, paragraph 2, of the Charter of the United Nations,

*Mindful* of the fact that it is essential to provide the United Nations Transition Assistance Group with the necessary financial resources to enable it to fulfil its responsibilities under the relevant resolutions of the Security Council,

*Urging* all Member States to make every possible effort to ensure payment of their assessed contributions to the United Nations Transition Assistance Group in full and on time, especially in view of the urgent need for and the magnitude of the start-up costs required for the Group,

*Recognizing* that, in order to meet the expenditures caused by the United Nations Transition Assistance Group, a different procedure is required from the one applied to meet expenditures of the regular budget of the United Nations,

*Taking into account* the fact that the economically more developed countries are in a position to make relatively larger contributions and that the economically less developed countries have a relatively limited capacity to contribute towards such an operation,

*Bearing in mind* the special responsibilities of the States permanent members of the Security Council, as indicated in General Assembly resolution 1874 (S-IV) of 27 June 1963, in the financing of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group,

*Noting with appreciation* that voluntary contributions have been made to the United Nations Transition Assistance Group,

1. *Concurs* with the observations, recommendations and conclusions contained in the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions;<sup>7</sup>

2. *Decides* to appropriate an amount of 416,162,000 United States dollars, inclusive of the amount of 450,000 dollars authorized by the Secretary-General for pre-implementation expenses and of the amount of 10 million dollars authorized with the concurrence of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, under the terms of General Assembly resolution 42/227 of 21 December 1987, for the operation of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group for its mandate period beginning on 1 April 1989 as authorized by the Security Council, bearing in mind that this amount corresponds, in part, to the deployment of 4,650 troops all ranks of the authorized upper limit of 7,500 troops all ranks, and requests the Secretary-General to establish a special account for the Group;

3. *Decides*, as an *ad hoc* arrangement, to apportion:

(a) An amount of 240,083,840 dollars for the above-mentioned period among the States permanent members of the Security Council in the proportions determined by the scale of assessments for the years 1989, 1990 and 1991;<sup>9</sup>

(b) An amount of 165,091,465 dollars for the above-mentioned period among the economically developed Member States that are not permanent members of the Security

Council in the proportions determined by the scale of assessments for the years 1989, 1990 and 1991;

(c) An amount of 10,786,919 dollars for the above-mentioned period among the economically less developed Member States in the proportions determined by the scale of assessments for the years 1989, 1990 and 1991;

(d) An amount of 199,776 dollars for the above-mentioned period to the following of the economically less developed Member States in the proportions determined by the scale of assessments for the years 1989, 1990 and 1991: Afghanistan, Angola, Antigua and Barbuda, Bangladesh, Belize, Benin, Bhutan, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cape Verde, Chad, Comoros, Democratic Yemen, Djibouti, Dominica, Ethiopia, Grenada, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Haiti, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Lesotho, Malawi, Maldives, Mali, Mozambique, Nepal, Niger, Papua New Guinea, Rwanda, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Samoa, Sao Tome and Principe, Senegal, Seychelles, Solomon Islands, Somalia, Sudan, Suriname, Uganda, United Republic of Tanzania, Vanuatu, Yemen and Zimbabwe;

4. *Decides* that, for the purpose of the present resolution, the term "economically less developed Member States" in paragraph 3 (c) above shall mean all Member States except Australia, Austria, Belgium, the Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic, Canada, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, Finland, the German Democratic Republic, Germany, Federal Republic of, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Poland, South Africa, Sweden, the Ukrainian Soviet Socialist Republic and the Member States referred to in paragraphs 3 (a) and (d) above;

5. *Decides* that, in accordance with the provisions of its resolution 973 (X) of 15 December 1955, there shall be set off against the apportionment among Member States, as provided for in paragraph 3 above, their respective share in the Tax Equalization Fund of the estimated staff assessment income of 9,541,000 dollars approved for the above-mentioned period;

6. *Invites* voluntary contributions to the United Nations Transition Assistance Group both in cash and in the form of services and supplies acceptable to the Secretary-General, to be administered, as appropriate, in accordance with the

procedure established by the General Assembly in section II of its resolution 43/230 of 21 December 1988;

7. *Requests* the Secretary-General to make every effort to avail himself of the widest possible sources of procurement, consistent with the requirements of the mandate and with economy and efficiency, taking into account the relevant resolutions and decisions of the General Assembly and the Security Council;

8. *Also requests* the Secretary-General to proceed without delay with the necessary arrangements for the funding of the programme of repatriation of refugees and exiles, which is to be carried out by the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, as indicated in paragraph 42 of the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, taking into account that the repatriation programme is an integral part of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group operation;

9. *Recognizes* that follow-up activities to the repatriation programme, including assistance in the resettlement of refugees and exiles, are to be carried out by United Nations bodies, including, *inter alia*, the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees, the United Nations Development Programme, the United Nations Children's Fund, the World Food Programme and the World Health Organization, and will continue past the end of the mandate of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group;

10. *Requests* the Secretary-General to take all necessary action to ensure that the United Nations Transition Assistance Group is administered with the maximum of efficiency and economy, bearing in mind the relevant observations contained in the report of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions;

11. *Decides* to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-fourth session the item entitled "Financing of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group";

12. *Requests* the Secretary-General to submit to the General Assembly, at its forty-fourth and forty-fifth sessions, detailed performance reports on the budget of the United Nations Transition Assistance Group, as recommended by the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions in paragraph 45 of its report.

## A. ELECTIONS AND APPOINTMENTS

### 43/327. Election of a member of the International Court of Justice

The General Assembly, at its 91st plenary meeting, on 18 April 1989, and the Security Council at its 2854th meeting, on the same date, proceeded independently of one another to elect, in accordance with Articles 2 to 4, 7 to 12 and 14 and 15 of the Statute of the International Court of Justice, rules 150 and 151 of the rules of procedure of the Assembly and rules 40 and 61 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Council, a member of the Court for a term of office expiring on 5 February 1991 to fill a vacancy resulting from the death of Mr. Nagendra SINGH (India).<sup>10</sup> The following person was elected:

Mr. Raghunandan Swarup Pathak (India).

its destructive consequences in southern Africa would be held from 12 to 14 December 1989, on the understanding that at its forty-fourth session it would hold its debate on the item entitled "Policies of *apartheid* of the Government of South Africa" three to four weeks before the special session.

#### **43/463. Armed Israeli aggression against Iraqi nuclear installations and its grave consequences for the established international system concerning the peaceful uses of nuclear energy, the non-proliferation of nuclear weapons and international peace and security**

At its 90th plenary meeting, on 7 March 1989, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Second Committee,<sup>15</sup> decided to convene from 23 to 27 April 1990, on the basis of the provisions set out in the annex to the present decision, a special session devoted to international economic co-operation, in particular to the revitalization of economic growth and development of the developing

countries, and to include in the provisional agenda of its forty-fourth session an item entitled "Preparations for the special session of the General Assembly in 1990".

#### **ANNEX**

##### *Special session of the General Assembly to be held in 1990*

##### **I. PURPOSE**

1. In a rapidly changing and increasingly interdependent world, it is in the common interest of all members of the international community to take stock of the significance of the transformation of the world economy, to consider in greater depth ways and means of meeting the challenges and opportunities ahead, particularly those of the developing countries, and to provide more effective means of multilateral co-operation in the economic field. Concerted efforts will benefit all countries and will help ensure sustained growth in the world economy and particularly the recovery and

restoration of economic growth and development in developing countries. A special session of the General Assembly is the appropriate forum for this purpose.

## II. FOCUS

2. With a view to attaining the above-stated purpose, the special session will be a forum for dialogue, discussion and deliberation, focusing on enhanced international and regional economic co-operation, improved policy co-ordination and the formulation of policy recommendations. The General Assembly will review problems facing the world economy, consider the pressing priority issues in international economic relations, including the need for recovery and revitalization of growth and development in developing countries, and address those problems and issues taking into account their interrelationships. In this regard, the respective spheres of competence of the specialized institutions are recognized.

## III. LINKAGE

3. The nature and importance of the issues merit a special session with the full and highest possible level of participation of all delegations. The session will be able to provide appropriate policy guidance and recommendations for the activities of the international community and the relevant bodies within the United Nations system. It could also provide useful guidelines for an international development strategy for the 1990s, as well as for other relevant United Nations plans and programmes of action for development.

## IV. OUTCOME

4. The outcome should be a document reflecting a common understanding on appropriate policy guidance and recommendations and providing more effective means of multilateral co-operation in the economic field. The final document should be based on constructive dialogue, embody new approaches and reflect a new spirit in international co-operation. It should also help to generate and sharpen public awareness.

## V. PREPARATIONS

5. The special session shall take place at United Nations Headquarters, from 23 to 27 April 1990.

6. The President of the General Assembly is invited to participate actively in the preparations for the session.

7. An intergovernmental preparatory committee of the whole shall be established to make the necessary preparations for the special session. The preparatory committee shall prepare the provisional agenda and submit a draft final document to the General Assembly at the special session.

8. In the light of paragraphs 1 to 4 above, the Secretary-General shall submit to the preparatory committee a comprehensive report on the state of international economic co-operation, in particular on effective ways and means of revitalizing the economic growth and development of the developing countries. The Secretary-General, in consultation with the President of the General Assembly, is requested to carry out appropriate high-level consultations, including consultations with eminent personalities, in the preparation of his report, in order to contribute to the success of the special session.

9. The preparatory committee shall hold an organizational session in early March 1989 to elect its Bureau. The preparatory committee shall hold a brief session in June 1989 to consider the preliminary outline of the report of the Secretary-General and shall also hold two other sessions of one week each, as and when required.

10. The Chairman of the preparatory committee shall report to the Economic and Social Council at its second regular session of 1989 on the work of the committee. The preparatory committee shall report to the General Assembly at its forty-fourth session on the progress of work.

11. In the light of paragraph 3 above, it is stressed that the preparatory processes for the special session and for the international development strategy for the fourth United Nations development decade, as well as for other plans and programmes of the United Nations in the field of development and international economic co-operation, should be complementary and mutually supportive.
