## Report of the Fifth Committee

- At its 54th meeting, on 17 December 1991, the Fifth Committee, pursuant to rule 153 of the rules of procedure of the General Assembly, considered the statement submitted by the Secretary-General (A/C.5/46/74) on the programme budget implications of the draft resolution recommended by the Second Committee in its report (A/46/729, para. 13). The related reports of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions and the Committee on Conferences were presented orally by their Chairmen.
- Statements and comments made in the course of the Committee's consideration of this item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/46/SR.54).
- The representative of Japan made a statement in explanation of position 3. after the decision was taken.

## DECISION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

- 4. The Fifth Committee decided, without a vote, to inform the General Assembly that, should it adopt the draft resolution recommended by the Second Committee in its report:  $\underline{1}$ /
- (a) The new activities indicated in paragraph 5 of document A/C.5/46/74 would be added under new section 11F of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1992-1993;
- (b) An additional appropriation in the amount of \$1,176,300 would be required under section 11 of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1992-1993 in connection with the activities of the ad hoc secretariat subject to the guidelines for the operation and use of the contingency fund;
- (c) Furthermore, an exception to General Assembly resolution 40/243 would be granted for holding the fifth session and resumed fifth session of the International Negotiating Committee in New York; and
- (d) The Secretary-General and the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions would be requested to keep under review the staffing requirements of the International Negotiating Committee in the light of the activities mandated in the resolution.
