Appendix

Talking points dated 31 May 1994

The Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus has the political will to conclude an agreement on mutual confidence-building measures with the hope and expectation of facilitating a comprehensive settlement that will take account of the existing realities in the island and will be based on the political and legal equality of the two sides and on equal power-sharing.

With this political will, the Turkish Cypriot side is prepared to accept the ideas of Ambassador Robert Lamb, United States Special Coordinator for Cyprus, on "access and security" regarding the fenced area of Varosha and the United Nations map relating thereto on the understanding that agreements reached at the meeting with the Secretary-General's Deputy Special Representative for Cyprus, Mr. Gustave Feissel, held in Vienna on 11 and 12 May 1994, on the ideas put forward by Ambassador Robert Lamb, set out under the following headings, will be incorporated in the text of the confidence-building measures agreement to be reached between the two sides:

- (a) Nicosia International Airport;
- (b) Benefits (travel documents, international assistance, landing rights);
- (c) Varosha.

The Turkish Cypriot side is prepared to engage itself in finalizing the text of the Vienna provisions to be incorporated in the text of the confidence-building measures agreement.
