- Item 3. Coordination of the policies and activities of the specialized agencies and other bodies of the United Nations system related to the following theme
- (a) Coordinated follow-up by the United Nations system and implementation of the results of the major international conferences organized by the United Nations in the economic, social and related fields

1. In its agreed conclusions/1995/1, the Economic and Social Council decided that a theme related to the follow-up of conferences, to be considered at the coordination segment, should be chosen at the Council's previous substantive session to allow for adequate preparations by the functional commissions, other relevant intergovernmental bodies and the Secretariat. The Council also invited the Secretary-General, taking into account the suggestions made in paragraph 57 of his report (E/1995/86) and based on the work of relevant subsidiary bodies and through consultations with Member States, relevant organs of the United Nations system and specialized agencies, to offer suggestions for possible common themes for consideration and decision by the Council. The suggestions of the Secretary-General will be before the Council at its resumed substantive session for consideration and decision.

2. Establishment of a working group of the Commission on Human Rights to elaborate a draft declaration in accordance with paragraph 5 of General Assembly resolution 49/214 of 23 December 1994. In its resolution 1995/32, the Economic and Social Council authorized the establishment, as a matter of priority and from within existing overall United Nations resources, of an open-ended inter-sessional working group of the Commission on Human Rights with the sole purpose of elaborating a draft United Nations declaration on the rights of indigenous peoples.

3. In the same resolution, the Economic and Social Council invited applications from organizations of indigenous people not in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council that were interested in participating in the Working Group, and requested the Coordinator of the International Decade of the World's Indigenous People to forward all applications and information received to the Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations. The Council also requested the Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations to meet as necessary to examine the applications and, having considered all relevant information, to recommend to the Council those organizations of indigenous people that should be authorized to participate in the Working Group, including at its first session in 1995.

4. The Council will have to consider the report of the Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations (E/1995/108) as regards recommendations for accreditation of non-governmental organizations to the open-ended inter-sessional working group of the Commission on Human Rights.

(e) Advancement of women

5. Proposed merger of the International Research and Training Institute for the Advancement of Women and the United Nations Development Fund for Women. In its resolution 49/160, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to submit to the Economic and Social Council, through the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions, an updated report, which would contain, inter alia, the information requested in Council decision 1993/235 of 27 July 1993 and in paragraphs 2 and 3 of Assembly resolution 48/111, as well as the additional information requested by the Advisory Committee.

6. In the same resolution, the Assembly requested the Council to re-examine the issue, at a resumed session to take place after the Fourth World Conference on Women and before the Third Committee of the General Assembly considered the item on the advancement of women, taking into account the deliberations of the Commission on the Status of Women at its thirty-ninth session, of the Fourth World Conference on Women and of the Advisory Committee on Administrative and Budgetary Questions concerning institutional arrangements in the United Nations system for the advancement of women.

(f) Social development questions

7. (i) Tenth anniversary of the International Youth Year and world programme of action for youth to the year 2000 and beyond. At its 50th plenary meeting, on 24 July 1995, the Economic and Social Council decided, as recommended by the Commission for Social Development in its resolution 34/1, to establish an open-ended working group on youth during its resumed substantive session in September 1995, building upon the progress achieved by the open-ended working group of the Commission at its thirty-fourth session, to complete the

formulation of the draft world programme of action for youth to the year 2000 and beyond, to be submitted by the Secretary-General to the General Assembly at its fiftieth session (decision 1995/251).

8. (ii) Substantive theme to be considered by the Commission for Social Development at its special session. In its resolution 1995/60, the Economic and Social Council decided that the Commission for Social Development should hold a special session in 1996, in order, inter alia:

- (a) To review its mandate, terms of reference and scope of work;
- (b) To elaborate its multi-year programme of work;
- (c) To review the frequency of its meetings in light of the above and make recommendations thereon to the Council.

9. In the same resolution, the Council also decided that the substantive theme to be considered during the special session of the Commission in 1996 should be determined at the resumed substantive session of 1995 of the Council.

Item 6. Economic and environmental questions: reports of subsidiary bodies, conferences and related questions

- (e) Implementation of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development

10. In its resolution 1995/55, the Economic and Social Council decided to enlarge the membership of the Commission on Population and Development at a resumed session of the Council no later than 31 December 1995, recognizing the importance of adequate representation.

- (q) Public administration and development

11. In its resolution 49/136 on public administration and development, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to submit a consolidated report, through the Economic and Social Council to the Assembly at its resumed fiftieth session, containing an analysis of the role of public administration in development and recommendations for strengthening the role of the United Nations in public administration and development for the benefit of interested developing countries and countries with economies in transition.

(b) Calendar of conferences and meetings in the economic, social and related fields for the biennium 1996-1997

12. (i) In its decision 1995/311, the Economic and Social Council decided to retain the item entitled "Programme and related questions in the economic, social and related fields" in the agenda of its substantive session of 1995 in order to consider the question of the biennialization of the meetings of its subsidiary bodies. The Council will have before it for consideration the provisional calendar of conferences and meetings for 1996 and 1997 in the economic, social and related fields.

13. (ii) Programme of work in crime prevention and criminal justice. In its decision 1995/315, the Economic and Social Council decided to defer consideration of the draft resolution entitled "Programme of work in crime prevention and criminal justice" (E/1995/L.55) to its resumed substantive session of 1995.
