Note by the Secretary-General

Francis R. SPAIN

Date of birth: 2 November 1943

Upon completion of secondary school education, studied law at University College Dublin and King's Inns, Dublin

Graduated from University College Dublin in 1967 with Degree of Bachelor of Civil Law. Called to the Bar in 1968

Practised at the Irish Bar as a Junior Counsel until 1980

Called to the Inner Bar in 1980 and continued in practice as a Senior Counsel until 1987

Practice at the Bar covered a wide range of cases in the areas of criminal and civil law

1987: Appointed a Judge of the Circuit Court on 31 July 1987, dealing with every type of case, criminal and civil and family law

1991: Appointed President of the Circuit Court, and ex officio, a Judge of the High Court on 27 June 1991. The post involves the administration of the Circuit Court for the entire country and, inter alia, the hearing of the appeals that come to the Court in Dublin from the Employment Appeals Tribunal

Bencher of the King's Inns. This body regulates the system of education of future barristers and all matters pertaining to the work practices, discipline and regulation of the Bar of Ireland

Member of the Committee of Court Practice and Procedure. This Committee advises the Minister for Justice on the various options to deal with any procedural problem in the Irish courts that might require legislation. The Committee also advises on the adoption of rules of practice in the courts

Chairperson of the Circuit Court Rules Committee

Chairperson of the Committee for the Revision of the Circuit Court, set up to recommend to the Government measures required to modernize and render more efficient the administration of the court throughout the country

Member of the United Nations Administrative Tribunal 1993-1995
