### I. INTRODUCTION

1. At its 3rd plenary meeting, on 22 September 1995, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the General Committee, decided to include in the agenda of its fiftieth session the item entitled:

"Activities of foreign economic and other interests which impede the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples in Territories under colonial domination."

At the same meeting, the Assembly decided to allocate the item to the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee).

2. At its 2nd meeting, on 4 October 1995, the Fourth Committee decided to hold a general debate covering agenda items 18, 88, 89, 90 and 12, and 91 on the understanding that individual proposals on matters covered by those items would be considered separately.

3. At the same meeting, the Fourth Committee decided, without objection and in accordance with established practice, to consider, in conjunction with agenda item 89, chapter VI of the report of the Special Committee on the Situation with

regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples relating to military activities and arrangements by colonial Powers in Territories under their administration. 1/

## II. CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSALS

4. The Fourth Committee considered item 89 at its 2nd, 5th to 7th and 14th meetings, on 4, 11 and 16 October and 3 November (see A/C.4/50/SR.2, 5-7 and 14). The general debate on the items referred to above, including the present item, took place at the 5th to 7th meetings, on 11 and 16 October.

5. Also at the 2nd meeting, on 4 October, the Rapporteur of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples made a statement in which he gave an account of the relevant activities of the Special Committee during 1995 and drew attention to chapter V of the report of that Committee relating to item 89, 1/ as well as the relevant working papers of the Committee (A/AC.109/2013 and Add.1, 2014, 2015 and Add.1, 2016 and Add.1, 2019 and Add.1 and 2020 and Add.1). The Rapporteur also gave an account of the Committee's consideration, in pursuance of paragraph 7 of General Assembly decision 49/417 of 9 December 1994, of the question of military activities and arrangements by colonial Powers in Territories under their administration and drew attention to chapter VI of the report of the Committee. 1/

6. At the 14th meeting, on 3 November, the representative of Spain, on behalf of the European Union, introduced amendments (A/C.4/50/L.7) to the draft resolution on foreign economic and other interests, contained in document A/50/23 (Part III), chapter V, paragraph 16. The amendments consisted of the following:

(a) The title of the item would be replaced by:

"Economic and other activities which affect the interests of the peoples in Non-Self-Governing Territories";

(b) In the third preambular paragraph:

(i) The phrase "containing the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples" would be deleted;

(ii) The word "relevant" would be inserted after "other";

(iii) The words "on this subject" would be deleted;

(iv) The phrase "endorsing the plan of action for the International Decade for the Eradication of Colonialism" would be deleted;

(c) The fifth preambular paragraph would be deleted;

(d) In the sixth preambular paragraph, the words "colonial and" would be deleted;

(e) The tenth preambular paragraph would be replaced by the following:

"Concerned about any activities aimed at the exploitation of the natural and human resources of the Non-Self-Governing Territories to the detriment of the interests of the inhabitants of those Territories";

(f) In operative paragraph 1, the phrase:

"Reaffirms the inalienable right of the peoples of colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories to self-determination and independence"

would be replaced by:

"Reaffirms the right of the peoples of Non-Self-Governing Territories to self-determination in conformity with the Charter of the United Nations and General Assembly resolution 1514 (XV), containing the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples";

(g) The following paragraph would be inserted as new operative paragraph 2:

"2. Affirms the value of foreign economic investment undertaken in collaboration with the people of the Non-Self-Governing Territories and in accordance with their wishes in order to make a valid contribution to the socio-economic development of the Territories";

(h) Former operative paragraph 2 would be replaced by the following operative paragraph 3:

"3. Reaffirms the responsibility of the administering Powers under the Charter to promote the political, economic, social and educational advancement of the Non-Self-Governing Territories, and reaffirms the legitimate rights of their peoples over their natural resources";

(i) The subsequent operative paragraphs would be renumbered;

(j) In former operative paragraph 3 (present operative paragraph 4):

(i) The phrase "Reaffirms its concern about the activities of those foreign economic, financial and other interests which continue to exploit" would be replaced by "Reaffirms its concern about any activities aimed at the exploitation of";

(ii) The words "colonial and" would be deleted;

(iii) The phrase "thus depriving them of their right to control the resources of their Territories and impeding the realization by those

peoples of their legitimate aspirations for self-determination and independence" would be replaced by "and in such a way as to deprive them of their right to dispose of those resources";

(k) Former operative paragraph 4 (present operative paragraph 5) would be replaced by:

"5. Affirms the need to avoid any economic and other activities which adversely affect the interests of the peoples in Non-Self-Governing Territories";

(l) In former operative paragraph 5 (present operative paragraph 6):

(i) The words ", if any," would be inserted after "jurisdiction";

(ii) The words "colonial and" would be deleted;

(iii) The phrase "in order to put an end to such enterprises" would be replaced by "in order to put an end to such practices";

(iv) The phrase "and to prevent new investments that run counter to the interests of the inhabitants of those Territories" would be deleted;

(m) In former operative paragraph 6 (present operative paragraph 7):

(i) The word "damaging" would be inserted before "exploitation";

(ii) The words "colonial and" would be deleted;

(iii) The phrase "by foreign economic interests" would be deleted;

(n) In former operative paragraph 7 (present operative paragraph 8):

(i) The phrase "to take all possible measures" would be deleted;

(ii) The words "colonial and" would be deleted;

(o) In former operative paragraph 8 (present operative paragraph 9):

(i) The phrase "to take effective measures" would be replaced by "to continue to take effective measures";

(ii) The words "colonial and" would be deleted;

(iii) The phrase "to take all necessary steps" would be replaced by "to continue to take all necessary steps";

(p) In former operative paragraph 9 (present operative paragraph 10):

(i) The words "and unjust wage systems or" would be deleted;

- (ii) The phrase "to apply in each Territory a uniform system of wages" would be replaced by "to promote in each Territory a fair system of wages applicable";

(q) In former operative paragraph 10 (present operative paragraph 11), the phrase "those activities of foreign economic and other interests which impede the implementation of the Declaration" would be replaced by "the necessity to avoid damaging exploitation of the natural resources of the Non-Self-Governing Territories";

(r) In former operative paragraph 11 (present operative paragraph 12), the phrase "for the full implementation of the Declaration" would be replaced by "to promote the economic well-being of the peoples of the Non-Self-Governing Territories";

(s) In former operative paragraph 12 (present operative paragraph 13):

(i) The words "monitor closely" would be replaced by "follow";

- (ii) The phrase "in order to facilitate and accelerate the exercise by the peoples of those Territories of their right to self-determination and independence" would be deleted;

(t) In former operative paragraph 13 (present operative paragraph 14), the words "fifty-first" would be replaced by "fifty-second".

7. Also at the 14th meeting, statements in connection with the amendments were made by the representatives of Sierra Leone (in his capacity as Acting Chairman of the Special Committee of 24), Colombia (on behalf of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries), Papua New Guinea (in his capacity as Chairman of the Subcommittee on Small Territories, Petitions, Information and Assistance), Cuba, the Russian Federation, the United States of America, the United Republic of Tanzania and the Syrian Arab Republic (see A/C.4/50/SR.14).

8. At the same meeting, the Fourth Committee took the following action on the amendments contained in document A/C.4/50/L.7 to the draft resolution on foreign economic and other interests (A/50/23 (Part III), chap. V, para. 16):

(a) The Committee rejected the amendment to replace the title by a recorded vote of 55 to 48, with 22 abstentions. 2/ The voting was as follows:

III. RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SPECIAL POLITICAL AND  
DECOLONIZATION COMMITTEE (FOURTH COMMITTEE)

11. The Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

Activities of foreign economic and other interests which impede  
the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of  
Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples in Territories  
under colonial domination

The General Assembly,

Having considered the item entitled "Activities of foreign economic and other interests which impede the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples in Territories under colonial domination",

Having examined the chapter of the report of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples relating to the item, 6/

Recalling its resolution 1514 (XV) of 14 December 1960, as well as all its other relevant resolutions, including, in particular, resolution 46/181 of 19 December 1991, endorsing the plan of action for the International Decade for the Eradication of Colonialism, 7/

Reaffirming the solemn obligation of the administering Powers under the Charter of the United Nations to promote the political, economic, social and educational advancement of the inhabitants of the Territories under their administration and to protect the human and natural resources of those Territories against abuses,

Reaffirming also that any economic or other activity that constitutes an obstacle to the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples and obstructs efforts aimed at the elimination of colonialism is a direct violation of the rights of the inhabitants and of the principles of the Charter and all relevant resolutions of the United Nations,

Reaffirming further that the natural resources are the heritage of the indigenous populations of the colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories,

Aware of the special circumstances of the geographical location, size and economic conditions of each Territory and bearing in mind the need to promote economic stability, diversification and strengthening of the respective economy of each Territory,

Conscious of the particular vulnerability of the small Territories to natural disasters and environmental degradation,

Conscious also that foreign economic investment when done in collaboration with the peoples of the Non-Self-Governing Territories and in accordance with their wishes could make a valid contribution to the socio-economic development of the Territories and could also make a valid contribution to the exercise of their rights to self-determination,

Concerned about the activities of those foreign economic, financial and other interests which exploit the natural and human resources of the Non-Self-Governing Territories to the detriment of the interests of the inhabitants of those Territories and deprive them of their right to control the wealth of their countries,

Bearing in mind the relevant provisions of the final documents of the successive Conferences of Heads of State or Government of Non-Aligned Countries and of the resolutions adopted by the Assembly of Heads of State and Government of the Organization of African Unity, the South Pacific Forum and the Caribbean Community,

1. Reaffirms the inalienable right of the peoples of colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories to self-determination and independence and to the enjoyment of the natural resources of their Territories, as well as their right to dispose of those resources in their best interests;

2. Affirms the value of foreign economic investment undertaken in collaboration with the people of the Non-Self-Governing Territories and in accordance with their wishes in order to make a valid contribution to the socio-economic development of the Territories;

3. Reiterates that any administering Power that deprives the colonial peoples of Non-Self-Governing Territories of the exercise of their legitimate rights over their natural resources or subordinates the rights and interests of those peoples to foreign economic and financial interests, violates the solemn obligations it has assumed under the Charter of the United Nations;

4. Reaffirms its concern about the activities of those foreign economic, financial and other interests which continue to exploit the natural resources that are the heritage of the indigenous populations of the colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories in the Caribbean, the Pacific and other regions, as well as their human resources, to the detriment of their interests, thus depriving them of their right to control the resources of their Territories and impeding the realization by those peoples of their legitimate aspirations for self-determination and independence;

5. Reiterates its deep concerns about those activities of foreign economic and other interests in the colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories which are impeding the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, contained in its resolution 1514 (XV), and the efforts to eliminate colonialism;

6. Calls once again upon all Governments that have not yet done so to take, in accordance with the relevant provisions of its resolution 2621 (XXV) of 12 October 1970, legislative, administrative or other measures in respect of their nationals and the bodies corporate under their jurisdiction, if any, that own and operate enterprises in colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories that are detrimental to the interests of the inhabitants of those Territories, in order to put an end to such practices and to prevent new investments that run counter to the interests of the inhabitants of those Territories;

7. Reiterates that the damaging exploitation and plundering of the marine and other natural resources of colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories by foreign economic interests, in violation of the relevant resolutions of the United Nations, is a threat to the integrity and prosperity of those Territories;

8. Invites all Governments and organizations of the United Nations system to ensure that the permanent sovereignty of the peoples of colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories over their natural resources is fully respected and safeguarded;

9. Urges the administering Powers concerned to continue to take effective measures to safeguard and guarantee the inalienable right of the peoples of the colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories to their natural resources and to establish and maintain control over the future development of those resources, and requests the administering Powers to continue to take all necessary steps to protect the property rights of the peoples of those Territories;

10. Calls upon the administering Powers concerned to ensure that no discriminatory working conditions prevail in the Territories under their administration and to promote in each Territory a fair system of wages applicable to all the inhabitants without any discrimination;

11. Requests the Secretary-General to continue, through all means at his disposal, to inform world public opinion of those activities of foreign economic and other interests which impede the implementation of the Declaration;

12. Appeals to the mass media, trade unions and non-governmental organizations, as well as individuals, to continue their efforts for the full implementation of the Declaration;

13. Decides to continue to follow the situation in the colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories so as to ensure that all economic activities in those Territories are aimed at strengthening and diversifying their economies in the interest of the indigenous peoples and at promoting the economic and financial viability of those Territories, in order to facilitate and accelerate the exercise by the peoples of those Territories of their right to self-determination and independence;

14. Requests the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples to continue to examine this question and to report thereon to the General Assembly at its fifty-first session.

12. The Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee) also recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft decision:

Military activities and arrangements by colonial Powers in  
Territories under their administration

1. The General Assembly, having considered the chapter of the report of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples relating to an item on the agenda of the Special Committee entitled "Military activities and arrangements by colonial Powers in Territories under their administration", 8/ and recalling its resolution 1514 (XV) of 14 December 1960 and all other relevant resolutions and decisions of the United Nations relating to military activities in colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories, reaffirms its strong conviction that military bases and installations in the Territories concerned could constitute an obstacle to the exercise by the people of those Territories of their right to self-determination, and reiterates its strong views that existing bases and installations, which are impeding the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, should be withdrawn.

2. Aware of the presence of such bases and installations in some of those Territories, the General Assembly urges the administering Powers concerned to continue to take all necessary measures not to involve those Territories in any offensive acts or interference against other States.

3. The General Assembly reiterates its concern that military activities and arrangements by colonial Powers in Territories under their administration might run counter to the rights and interests of the colonial peoples concerned,

especially their right to self-determination and independence. The Assembly once again calls upon the administering Powers concerned to terminate such activities and to eliminate such military bases in compliance with its relevant resolutions.

4. The General Assembly reiterates that the colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories and areas adjacent thereto should not be used for nuclear testing, dumping of nuclear wastes or deployment of nuclear and other weapons of mass destruction.

5. The General Assembly deplores the continued alienation of land in colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories, particularly in the small island Territories of the Pacific and Caribbean regions, for military installations. The large-scale utilization of the local resources for this purpose could adversely affect the economic development of the Territories concerned.

6. The General Assembly takes note of the decision of some of the administering Powers to close or downsize some of those military bases in the Non-Self-Governing Territories.

7. The General Assembly requests the Secretary-General to continue to inform world public opinion of those military activities and arrangements in colonial and Non-Self-Governing Territories which constitute an obstacle to the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples.

8. The General Assembly requests the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples to continue to examine this question and to report thereon to the Assembly at its fifty-first session.
