1. Under the terms of operative paragraph 5 of the draft resolution, the General Assembly would decide that the membership of the Commission on Population and Development be increased to 47 States, selected by the Economic and Social Council from among the members of the United Nations and members of its specialized agencies, bearing in mind that the representatives of Governments nominated to serve on the Commission should preferably have relevant background in population and development, in order to ensure that it fulfil its functions as reflected in its updated and enhanced mandate, taking into account the integrated multidisciplinary and comprehensive approach of the Programme of Action and the membership of the other functional commissions of the Council.
2. The resources for the activities of the Commission on Population and Development have been proposed under section 8 (Department for Economic and Social Information and Policy Analysis) of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1996-1997 on the basis of the Commission's current membership (27 members) and modalities of work established by the General Assembly in its resolution 49/128 of 19 December 1994.

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3. An increase in the membership of the Commission to 47 States, as proposed in operative paragraph 5 of the draft resolution, would result in additional requirements to meet travel costs of the members of the Commission attending its annual sessions in 1996-1997 in the amount of $\$ 67,000$.
4. It is expected that the above requirements could be accommodated from within the provision proposed for the Commission under section 8 (Department for Economic and Social Information and Policy Analysis) of the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1996-1997.
