Report of the Fifth Committee (Part II)

I. INTRODUCTION

1. The previous recommendations made by the Fifth Committee to the General Assembly under agenda item 138 appear in the report of the Committee contained in document A/50/821.

2. The Fifth Committee further considered the item entitled "Administrative and budgetary aspects of the financing of the United Nations peace-keeping operations" at its 44th meeting, on 21 December 1995. Statements and observations made in the course of the Committee's consideration of the item are reflected in the relevant summary record (A/C.5/50/SR.44).

II. CONSIDERATION OF DRAFT DECISION PRESENTED BY THE CHAIRMAN

3. At its 44th meeting, on 21 December 1995, the Rapporteur introduced a draft decision (A/C.5/50/L.14), which was adopted without a vote.

III. RECOMMENDATION OF THE FIFTH COMMITTEE

4. The Fifth Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft decision:

Administrative and budgetary aspects of the financing of the
United Nations peace-keeping operations

The General Assembly decides, as an ad hoc arrangement, in respect of the composition of groups set out in paragraphs 3 and 4 of General Assembly resolution 43/232 of 1 March 1989, as adjusted by the Assembly in its resolutions 44/192 B of 21 December 1989, 45/269 of 27 August 1991, 46/198 A of 20 December 1991 and 47/218 A of 23 December 1992 and its decision 48/472 A of 23 December 1993, for the apportionment of peace-keeping appropriations, that Palau shall be included in the group of Member States set out in paragraph 3 (d) of Assembly resolution 43/232 and that its contributions to the financing of peace-keeping operations shall be calculated in accordance with the provisions of the relevant resolutions to be adopted by the Assembly regarding the scale of assessments.
