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HUMAN RIGHTS COMMITTEE Fifty-sixth session New York 18 March-4 April 1996

PROVISIONAL AGENDA AND ANNOTATIONS

Note by the Secretary-General

- 1. The fifty-sixth session of the Human Rights Committee will be held at United Nations Headquarters from 18 March to 4 April 1996. The first meeting will be convened on Monday, 18 March 1996 at 10.30 a.m.
- 2. In accordance with rule 6 of the Committee's rules of procedure, the Secretary-General has prepared, in consultation with the Chairman of the Committee, the attached provisional agenda for the fifty-sixth session. Annotations to the provisional agenda are also attached.
- 3. Pursuant to rule 33 of the Committee's rules of procedure the meetings of the Committee will be held in public unless the Committee decides otherwise or it appears from the relevant provisions of the Covenant or the Optional Protocol that the meetings should be held in private.
- 4. The attention of States parties is drawn, in particular, to the annotations to item 6 which contain the tentative timetable for the consideration of reports at the fifty-sixth session. In accordance with rule 68 of the Committee's rules of procedure, representatives of States parties may be present at the meetings of the Committee when their reports are examined.
- 5. At its fifty-fifth session, the Committee decided that two working groups, established under rules 62 and 89 of its rules of procedure, should meet for a period of one week prior to its fifty-sixth session. The working groups are scheduled to meet at United Nations Headquarters from 11 to 15 March 1996.

ANNOTATIONS

1. Adoption of the agenda.

Under rule 8 of the Committee's rules of procedure, the first item on the provisional agenda for any session shall be the adoption of the agenda. In accordance with rule 9, during a session, the Committee may revise the agenda and may, as appropriate, defer or delete items; only urgent and important items may be added to the agenda.

2. <u>Solemn declaration by the newly elected member of the Committee in</u> accordance with article 38 of the Covenant.

In accordance with article 38 of the Covenant and rule 16 of the Committee's rules of procedure, the member of the Committee who will be elected by a meeting of States parties to the Covenant to fill a vacancy in the Committee resulting from the resignation of Mrs. Rosalyn Higgins (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland) will make the following solemn declaration:

"I solemnly undertake to discharge my duties as a member of the Human Rights Committee impartially and conscientiously".

3. Organizational and other matters.

Under this item, the Committee will consider its programme of work for the session. In this connection, it may be noted that the Committee decided at its fifty-fifth session to set up, in addition to the pre-sessional working group on communications, a working group under article 40 of the Covenant to prepare concise lists of issues concerning reports scheduled for consideration at the fifty-sixth session, and to further review the Committee's procedures under article 40 of the Covenant, in the light of the discussion on that subject at the Committee's fifty-fifth session.

4. Action by the General Assembly at its fiftieth session:

(a) Annual report submitted by the Human Rights Committee under article 45 of the Covenant

In accordance with the Committee's decision at its fifteenth session, a note indicating the matters raised in the course of the discussion of the annual report by the Third Committee, along with the relevant General Assembly resolution and other documentation pertaining to the International Covenants on Human Rights, will be circulated to members of the Committee.

(b) Effective implementation of United Nations instruments on human rights and effective functioning of bodies established pursuant to such instruments

A note indicating matters raised in the course of the discussion of the effective implementation of United Nations instruments on human rights and

effective functioning of bodies established pursuant to such instruments by the Third Committee together with the relevant General Assembly resolution will be circulated to members of the Committee.

5. Submission of reports by State parties under article 40 of the Covenant.

In accordance with rule 68 of the Committee's rules of procedure, the Secretary-General has informed the States parties concerned of the tentative dates on which their respective reports are scheduled for consideration by the Committee at its fifty-sixth session.

7. General comments of the Committee.

Following a decision taken by the Committee during its fifty-fifth session, discussion of draft general comments will henceforth be dealt with under a separate agenda item. Under this item, the Committee will resume consideration of a draft general comment relating to article 25 of the Covenant which had been initiated at its fifty-third session. It will also review past general comments with a view to identifying provisions of the Covenant which have not yet been addressed as well as comments which would deserve to be updated.

8. <u>Consideration of communications under the Optional Protocol to the Covenant.</u>

In accordance with the provisions of chapter XVII of the rules of procedure, the Committee will consider under this item communications which are or appear to be submitted to it under the Optional Protocol.

One hundred and twenty-eight communications are pending before the Committee from earlier sessions. Taking into account the deadlines established by the Committee for submission of further information from the parties, 41 cases (earlier declared admissible) may be considered for the adoption of final views and 87 cases may be considered for a decision on admissibility. In addition, the Committee will have before it summaries of a number of recently registered communications and summaries of new communications registered after its last session, together with an indication of any action which may have been taken by the Special Rapporteur for new communications.

In accordance with article 5, paragraph 3, of the Optional Protocol and rule 82 of the Committee's rules of procedure, this agenda item will be considered in closed meetings.

9. <u>Follow-up on views adopted pursuant to article 5, paragraph 4, of the Optional Protocol to the Covenant.</u>

Under this item, the Committee will assess the status of follow-up activities under the Optional Protocol and examine periodic reports submitted by the Special Rapporteur for the follow-up on views.
