POLICIES OF APARTHEID OF THE GOVERNMENT OF SOUTH AFRICA

Letter dated 29 May 1981 from the Secretary-General to the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Information of South Africa

I have received your letter of 27 May 1981 (A/36/290).

In view of the fact that you have requested its circulation as a document of the General Assembly, I am sure that you will not expect more than a simple acknowledgement from me.

It is, of course, no secret that the position of the main organs of the United Nations on the questions of <u>apartheid</u> and Namibia do not coincide with those of the Government of South Africa. Nevertheless, on my side I have observed strict moderation in my own statements precisely in order to facilitate the process of peaceful change in southern Africa.
