Draft decision

<u>Provisional agenda for the tenth session of the High-level</u> <u>Committee on the Review of Technical Cooperation among</u> <u>Developing Countries</u>

The High-level Committee,

Taking into account the views expressed at its ninth session,

1. <u>Approves</u> the following provisional agenda for its tenth session, to be held in 1997:

- 1. Opening of the session.
- 2. Election of the President of the session.
- 3. Election of officers other than the President.
- 4. Adoption of the agenda and organization of work.
- 5. Review of progress made in implementing the Buenos Aires Plan of Action and the decisions of the High-level Committee and implementation of the recommendations of the South Commission.
- 6. Consideration of reports of the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme:
 - (a) Progress made in the implementation of new directions for technical cooperation among developing countries;

- (b) Implementation of the guidelines for the review of policies and procedures by the United Nations development system concerning technical cooperation among developing countries.
- 7. Organizational and supportive arrangements for technical cooperation among developing countries (such as administrative, legal, information and financial).
- 8. Adoption of the report of the Working Group.
- 9. Provisional agenda for the eleventh session of the High-level Committee.
- 10. Other matters.
- 11. Adoption of the report on the session.

2. <u>Requests</u> its Bureau, in cooperation with the Administrator of the United Nations Development Programme, to adjust the draft provisional agenda for the tenth session, as approved at the ninth session, taking fully into account the results of the ninth session, as well as developments relevant to technical cooperation among developing countries around the world, including at the United Nations and other important international forums. The draft provisional agenda should be circulated to all States at the latest three months in advance of the tenth session.
