SUMMARY OF 1995 RECOMMENDATIONS FOR GENERAL RESOURCES AND SUPPLEMENTARY FUNDING PROGRAMMES

SUMMARY

The present document, known informally as the "round-up" document, has been prepared to facilitate review by the Executive Board of recommendations for new general resources programmes and supplementary funding proposals. The addendum to the present document also provides estimates of future expenditures for all the country programmes as well as regional and interregional projects, with a breakdown by sources of funding.

INTRODUCTION

- 1. The present "round-up" document summarizes all programme recommendations submitted for approval by the Executive Board at its second regular session of 1995. They include recommendations to be funded from general resources as well as recommendations for programmes to be financed from supplementary funds contributions. The paper includes 48 country programmes, 3 short-duration "bridging" recommendations for services for Palestinian children and women, 1 programme for an area office for the Central Asian republics and Kazakhstan, 1 recommendation for a subregional supplementary funding programme in South Asia and 1 recommendation for funding of the 1995 UNICEF Maurice Pate Award.
- 2. Requests for additional general resources for 26 countries for a total amount of \$22.7 million are recommended for approval to meet the required general resources planning level for the remaining year or years of the cycle approved by the Board at an earlier date. Countries requiring additional general resources are indicated in table 1 with asterisk (*) in the year funds are required. The most common reason for the need for additional general resources is the adjustment of countries' general resources planning levels as a result of the annual review of the countries' situations using Board-approved indicators for allocating general resources. General resources planning levels of countries also were adjusted to meet priority goals and objectives. These increases in country ceilings were made possible by equivalent reductions in global funds expenditures. Country-specific explanations are included in the programme recommendations. To limit the amount of documentation and to provide for continuity and coherence in describing previous cooperation, requests for additional general resources have been incorporated into the recommendations for either full or bridging country programmes.
- 3. The total amount of general resources recommended for programmes for approval at the current session is \$607.1 million, including \$1.0 million for overexpenditures. The total number of submissions is less as compared to the previous year, but almost twice as much in amount because the programme cycles of several large country programmes will end at or almost at the same time. These include the programmes for Afghanistan, Bangladesh, China, Indonesia, Myanmar, Uganda and Viet Nam. Details of the general resources submissions are shown by region and country in table 1, under the column "recommended funding from general resources for the period". Breakdowns of new recommendations from general resources by major programme fields and regions are provided in table 2.
- 4. The total amount of supplementary funding proposals at the current session is \$954.8 million. These proposals are listed separately by region and country in table 1, under the column "new supplementary funding proposals". Supplementary funding proposals for 6 countries and 1 interregional programme in the total amount of \$39.0 million for which no full-length general resources programmes are recommended for approval at the current session are presented in documents E/ICEF/1995/P/L.28, E/ICEF/1995/P/L.29, E/ICEF/1995/P/L.32, E/ICEF/1995/P/L.35, E/ICEF/1995/P/L.36 and E/ICEF/1995/P/L.37. A double asterisk (**) after the period covered indicates a supplementary funding proposal without a full general resources recommendation.
- 5. A comprehensive picture of approved general resources and supplementary funds for all the countries with which UNICEF cooperates, as well as of regional and interregional programmes, is provided separately in the addendum to the present document. It shows balances as of the end of 1994 of programmes approved earlier by the Board and new recommended general resources for review and approval by the current session of the Board. To provide a total picture of possible financing for the future, unfunded supplementary funding proposals for the country are also shown. It should be noted, however, that implementation will depend on funds being raised to finance these programmes.

6. In order to meet documentation deadlines, country programme recommendations and tables 1 and 2 of the present document were prepared before aggregate financial data for 1994 were finalized.
