<u>France, Germany, Honduras, Italy, Poland, Russian Federation,</u> <u>the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and</u> <u>the United States of America: draft resolution</u>

The Security Council,

<u>Recalling</u> all its previous relevant resolutions regarding the situation in Lebanon, including resolution 425 (1978) of 19 March 1978 which established the United Nations Interim Force in Lebanon (UNIFIL),

<u>Taking note</u> of the letters from the Permanent Representative of Lebanon to the President of the Security Council of 13 April 1996 (S/1996/280 and S/1996/281),

Bearing in mind the debate which took place at its 3653rd meeting on 15 April 1996 on the situation in the Middle East,

<u>Gravely concerned</u> at the consequences which the ongoing fighting could have for the peace and security of the region and for the furthering of the peace process in the Middle East, and <u>affirming</u> its full support for that process,

<u>Gravely concerned also</u> at all attacks on civilian targets, including residential areas, and at the loss of life and suffering among civilians,

<u>Stressing the need</u> for all concerned to respect fully the rules of international humanitarian law with regard to the protection of civilians,

<u>Gravely concerned further</u> at actions which seriously threaten the safety of UNIFIL and impede the implementation of its mandate, and <u>deploring</u> in particular the incident on 18 April 1996 in which shelling resulted in heavy loss of life among civilians at a UNIFIL site,

- 1. <u>Calls for</u> an immediate cessation of hostilities by all parties;
- 2. <u>Supports</u> the ongoing diplomatic efforts to this end;

3. <u>Reaffirms its commitment</u> to the territorial integrity, sovereignty and political independence of Lebanon within its internationally recognized boundaries and to the security of all States in the region, and <u>calls upon</u> all concerned fully to respect those principles;

4. <u>Calls upon</u> all concerned to respect the safety and security of civilians;

5. <u>Calls upon</u> all concerned to respect the safety, security and freedom of movement of UNIFIL and to allow it to fulfil its mandate without any obstacle or interference;

6. <u>Calls upon</u> Member States to offer humanitarian assistance to alleviate the suffering of the population and to assist the Government of Lebanon in the reconstruction of the country and <u>requests</u> the Secretary-General to ensure that the United Nations and its agencies play their part in meeting the humanitarian needs of the civilian population;

7. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to keep the Council informed of developments on a continuing basis;

8. <u>Decides</u> to remain seized of the matter.
