Venezuela: draft resolution

Follow-up action by the General Assembly on the resolution
adopted on 21 November 1995 by the Third United Nations
Conference to Review All Aspects of the Set of
Multilaterally Agreed Equitable Principles and Rules for
the Control of Restrictive Business Practices

The General Assembly,

Recalling its resolution 35/63 of 5 December 1980, whereby it adopted the Set of Multilaterally Agreed Equitable Principles and Rules for the Control of Restrictive Business Practices, including paragraph 1, section G, thereof, providing that an intergovernmental group of experts on restrictive business practices, operating within the framework of a committee of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development, would provide the institutional machinery,

Recalling in particular paragraph 3 of that resolution, whereby it requested the Trade and Development Board, at its twenty-second session, to establish an intergovernmental group of experts on restrictive business practices, operating within the framework of a committee of the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development, to perform the functions designated in section G of the Set of Principles and Rules,

Recalling further its decision 48/442 of 21 December 1993, convening the Third United Nations Conference to Review All Aspects of the Set of Multilaterally Agreed Equitable Principles and Rules for the Control of Restrictive Business Practices,

1. Takes note of the resolution adopted on 21 November 1995 by the Third United Nations Conference to Review All Aspects of the Set of Multilaterally Agreed Equitable Principles and Rules for the Control of Restrictive Business Practices; 1/

2. Endorses the recommendation contained in paragraph 14 of that resolution to change the title of the Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Restrictive Business Practices to "Intergovernmental Group of Experts on Competition Law and Policy".
