REPORT OF THE 1994 UNITED NATIONS/FOOD AND AGRICULTURE ORGANIZATION OF THE UNITED NATIONS PLEDGING CONFERENCE FOR THE WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME

A. Opening and duration of the session

1. The Conference met at United Nations Headquarters on 1 November 1994.

2. The Conference was opened, on behalf of the Secretary-General, by Mr. Ismat Kittani, Under-Secretary-General and Special Adviser to the Secretary-General.

B. <u>Attendance</u>

3. The Conference was attended by representatives of the Governments of the following States:

Afghanistan, Andorra, Angola, Argentina, Austria, Bangladesh, Belarus, Belgium, Brazil, Canada, China, Cuba, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Egypt, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Fiji, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Guatemala, Iceland, India, Indonesia, Ireland, Italy, Japan, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Malawi, Malta, Mexico, Netherlands, New Zealand, Nigeria, Norway, Oman, Pakistan, Portugal, Republic of Korea, Republic of Moldova, Romania, Rwanda, South Africa, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, United Republic of Tanzania, United States of America, Viet Nam.

4. Representatives of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations and the Regional Commissions New York Office also attended the Conference.
