### SUBSTANTIVE QUESTIONS

#### Review of publications by the Department of Public Information

#### Report of the Secretary-General

1. In paragraph 7 of its resolution 49/38 B of 9 December 1994, the General Assembly requested "the management of the Department of Public Information to review the Department's publications and proposals for publications to ensure that all publications fulfil an identifiable need, that they do not duplicate other publications inside or outside the United Nations system and that they are produced in a cost-effective manner, and to report thereon to the Committee on Information at its seventeenth substantive session".
2. The present report is submitted to the Committee on Information in response to that request. In compliance with the above resolution, the report covers both recurrent and non-recurrent publications produced by the Department of Public Information. A list of the non-recurrent publications issued during the period January-December 1994 is contained in annex I to the present report.
3. The publications produced and distributed by the Department relate to specific and topical issues before the Organization. They are released in response to the mandates established by the General Assembly, as well as to priorities set by Member States and directives of the Secretary-General. These publications are produced in accordance with the highest possible standards of quality and cost-effectiveness.
4. In order to ensure a streamlined approach and a unified responsibility within the Department for its print productions, a reorganization was introduced in 1994 so that all sections and units dealing with the production of recurrent and non-recurrent publications became part of the Publications Service.
5. The purpose of the publications released by the Department is:

(a) Promotion of the principles and goals of the United Nations;

(b) The overall generation of public support for the Organization and specifically the creation of awareness and support for its wide-ranging activities, including development, humanitarian assistance, major conferences and peace-keeping and other political missions;

(c) Provision of a timely response to an identified demand from target audiences, ensuring that other publications both within and outside the United Nations system are not duplicated.

#### I. RECURRENT PUBLICATIONS

6. The Department in 1994 continued the timely production and dissemination of its institutional, thematic and reference publications.

##### Institutional publications

(a) Report of the Secretary-General on the Work of the Organization

7. Immediately following its release as an official document, the Report of the Secretary-General on the Work of the Organization is produced by the Department in book format in the official languages of the Organization and, through the network of United Nations information centres and services, in non-official languages as well. Targeted for audiences such as government officials, representatives of the media, non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and the academic community, the publication meets an increasing demand for current, in-depth information on the work of the Organization in all major fields. The improved format and increased comprehensiveness of the presentation introduced by the Secretary-General since 1992, as well as the use of statistical material such as charts and tables, has further contributed to a wider interest in this major print product of the Department.

(b) Yearbook of the United Nations

8. The Yearbook of the United Nations, published annually in a single volume, is the most comprehensive and authoritative reference book on the work of the United Nations and the organizations of the United Nations system. It is designed to provide government offices, libraries and the research community with detailed and factual accounts of United Nations activities during a given calendar year. Based on official documentation, the Yearbook constitutes an invaluable and unique resource for in-depth information on various aspects of international issues dealt with by the major organs of the United Nations, its programmes and agencies.

9. Since 1992, the release of current editions has been maintained on a timely annual schedule and a programme is under way to eliminate the remaining backlog volumes (1989 and 1990) by 1997. In December 1994, the 1993 edition (the 47th volume) of the Yearbook of the United Nations was issued. Also, in October 1994 the first backlog edition covering the activities of the United Nations system in 1988 was published.

10. As a contribution to the commemoration of the fiftieth anniversary of the United Nations, the Department is preparing a special fiftieth-anniversary volume of the Yearbook scheduled for publication during 1995. The special edition will recount the historical, evolutionary process of the United Nations and its contribution as the centre for multilateral discourse and will highlight major achievements of the Organization over its 50-year span. The special edition will be prepared in the form of selections from the previous volumes of the Yearbook, beginning with the 1946/47 issue.

(c) UN Chronicle

11. This magazine is the most frequently issued, consolidated account of all major United Nations activities, in particular Security Council and General Assembly actions, development and humanitarian assistance, and United Nations peace-keeping and political missions. A selective review of the activities of United Nations bodies and specialized agencies in the economic, social and legal fields is also included.

12. Written in a journalistic style and aimed especially at teachers and university students, members of non-governmental organizations and individuals interested in international affairs; the factual material as presented in this publication does not duplicate other United Nations information efforts. While the Yearbook of the United Nations is available on a yearly basis, the UN Chronicle provides a concise overview of the work of the Organization on a quarterly basis. Since no other publication inside or outside the United Nations provides the same service, the UN Chronicle has a considerable market potential. The production of this publication, which is released in the six official languages, is administered by the United Nations Publications Board.

13. Recent surveys - the latest was in 1994 - show that UN Chronicle readers highly value its contents and would wish to receive the publication on a more frequent basis. The comprehensive nature of the publication has made it an attractive source of information for electronic dissemination, and it is currently sold, with royalties accruing to the United Nations, to a number of on-line users and CD-ROM firms.

(d) Everyone's United Nations

14. This publication presents a concise historical account of the overall activities of the United Nations and its common system. It provides detailed information on the structure of the United Nations system and its work in the fields of peacemaking, peace-keeping, disarmament, economic and social development, human rights, decolonization and international law. The latest edition (484 pages) was published in 1986 in English only. The 11th edition is scheduled for publication in mid-1995. Owing to financial constraints and in order to respond to new priorities within the Department's print output, the scheduled release of the publication for 1993 had to be postponed.

(e) Basic Facts about the United Nations

15. Continually revised and updated, this publication offers a concise account of the Organization's history and details the contributions it has made to the

major issues facing the international community. Basic Facts is published in English, French and Spanish for use by non-governmental organizations, educational institutions, teachers and students, and is distributed through United Nations offices and bookstores. The latest edition was issued in 1993 (291 pages) and an updated edition is intended for release in mid-1995.

(f) UN in Brief

16. This regularly updated, illustrated 20-page pamphlet provides general information about the United Nations and its principal organs and was initiated in response to growing demands for this type of information in a handy, easily absorbed format. It is targeted to individual and group visitors to the United Nations, students in particular, and is provided upon request.

(g) Image and Reality

17. This is a booklet produced in question-and-answer format, which is intended to foster an informed understanding of the role of the United Nations in international affairs, particularly among younger audiences. It is published in English, French and Spanish. An updated version is being prepared for publication late in 1995.

Thematic publications

(a) United Nations Blue Book Series

18. A notable innovation in the publications programme of the Department of Public Information in 1994 was the launching of the United Nations Blue Book Series. This authoritative series will provide primary United Nations research-and-reference materials to academics, policy makers, journalists and others interested in gaining a deeper understanding of the work of the Organization in its diverse aspects. Each volume in the series captures the vital legacy and documents the central role of the United Nations in a major international endeavour or issue. Every book contains an extensive introduction by the Secretary-General and brings together in one volume all the principal United Nations documentation related to the respective subject, including resolutions of the General Assembly and the Security Council, reports of the Secretary-General, texts of agreements and other historic documents. A chronology and two sets of indexes make the information provided in each publication readily accessible. This series is a major boon for researchers and historians in particular. The first volume in the series, published in December 1994, was entitled The United Nations and Apartheid, 1948-1994. The United Nations and Cambodia, 1991-1995 was published in January, The United Nations and Nuclear Non-Proliferation in February, and The United Nations and El Salvador, 1990-1995 in March 1995. Forthcoming titles include The United Nations and Mozambique, 1992-1995, The United Nations and Human Rights, The United Nations and Women and The United Nations and Somalia, 1992-1995.

(b) Development Update

19. Beginning in January 1994, the bimonthly newsletter Development Update has closely covered the preparation and outcome of the current cycle of United

Nations conferences on economic and social development. The publication reports on the preparatory work leading up to conferences, as well as on the conferences themselves and their follow-up. The Secretary-General's reports on An Agenda for Development and related discussions in intergovernmental bodies have also been prominently featured in the publication. Development Update has further expanded its reach to include United Nations human rights initiatives, NGO involvement, relevant United Nations reports and surveys, such as those issued by the United Nations Development Programme, the Department for Economic and Social Information and Policy Analysis and the International Labour Organization, and some of the smaller United Nations conferences on specific economic and social issues, such as money laundering and transnational crime, as well as the United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD) symposium on trade efficiency. The issues and goals of the major global conferences have been illuminated for Development Update readers by short interviews with heads of delegations or groups of Member States and officials of United Nations bodies and relevant agencies and programmes of the United Nations system. The newsletter is produced in English with a print run of 20,000 copies.

20. Development Update was commended by the Group of 77 at the Economic and Social Council review of United Nations public information activities and continues to evoke widespread interest in many quarters. Requests for the publication are increasingly being received from universities, schools, research institutes, development assistance programmes and corporations.

(c) Notes for Speakers

21. This publication is designed as a tool to assist speakers in the preparation of presentations about key issues before the Organization. In previous years, the publication was prepared annually and released prior to United Nations Day in October.

22. In response to audiences' demands and interests, the Department since 1993 has produced Notes for Speakers in connection with major conferences to provide background on the issues. The Department produced Notes for Speakers - Social Development in January 1995 to highlight the long-standing contributions of the United Nations in the area of social development. That edition drew much of its information and perspective from the preparations for the World Summit for Social Development; however, the information was also designed to be of use well beyond the Summit itself. Another issue of Notes for Speakers, which will be of relevance to the Fourth World Conference on Women, is scheduled for release in July 1995.

(d) Africa Recovery

23. The quarterly magazine Africa Recovery deals with actions of the United Nations system vis-à-vis Africa and covers international and regional developments in the areas of economic and social reform, resource flows, external debt, trade, economic diversification, and the impact of structural adjustment programmes. The publication is an essential element of the Campaign for Global Awareness of the Critical Economic Situation in Africa and is a key contribution to the United Nations New Agenda for the Development of Africa in

the 1990s, as specifically indicated in General Assembly resolution 46/151 of 18 December 1991. In addition to the magazine, multi-media information kits on progress made in the implementation of the New Agenda are produced in English and other languages as required. The magazine's targeted audiences include the media, representatives of development agencies, business leaders, non-governmental organizations, the academic community and policy makers on Africa at both multilateral and bilateral levels. In 1988 and 1992, Africa Recovery received the World Hunger Journalism Awards, and its articles continue to be reprinted by national and international newspapers. The magazine is published in English (23,000 copies) and French (8,000 copies). As it has with other publications, the Department recently conducted a readership survey of Africa Recovery to assess its relevance and importance to its audiences. The survey revealed that the publication is considered a highly informative magazine, which is used by 75 per cent of its readers in their professional work and as a reference source.

(e) Development Business

24. Published twice a month in newspaper format, Development Business provides technical information to organizations, consultants, companies and banking institutions interested in international bidding on economic development projects funded by the United Nations. Development Business is the only continuous United Nations publication that serves the procurement information needs of the private sector as well as Member State delegations and development banks. It helps developing countries and those in transition procure goods and services at internationally competitive prices. It must be pointed out that the demand for such information has risen over the past two years and is expected to intensify in response to rapidly integrating global markets.

25. The newspaper also contains articles about investing in the developing world and reports on the Organization's annual World Investment Report and the World Economic and Social Survey, as well as its contributions in the area of sustainable development. Development Business also offers an on-line computer service, known as Scan-a-Bid, for subscribers who want faster and more selective access to project and bidding information. The service provides users with daily updates of the information published in Development Business and permits them to search for data by region, country and economic sector. Development Business concentrates on broadening its audience through on-line information services and other, evolving methods of electronic communication. Development Business is sold by subscription only for \$495 a year.

Reference publications

(a) Index materials

26. In order to facilitate access to documents and other materials issued by the Organization, the Dag Hammarskjöld Library issues a number of recurrent reference publications for use by delegations and United Nations offices, as well as depository and other libraries. These publications include the quarterly UNDOC: Current Index and a cumulative annual edition of that publication on microfiche, as well as the sessional Indexes to Proceedings of the General Assembly, the Security Council, the Economic and Social Council and

the Trusteeship Council. It is planned that UNBIS Plus on CD-ROM, a quarterly electronic-format publication comprising all major bibliographic, factual, full-text, thesaurus and authority files, will be used as part of the Library's publications programme. All these publications are sales items.

(b) World Media Handbook

27. This is a comprehensive reference publication issued for use by information professionals of the United Nations system, media practitioners, public affairs agents, NGO representatives, as well as journalism and mass communication scholars world wide. The main purpose of the World Media Handbook is to provide information on media organizations world wide. The publication profiles countries that are Member States of the United Nations, as well as Switzerland, which is host to a number of United Nations organizations, by further providing basic demographic data and communications statistics. It is published in English. The World Media Handbook was recognized in 1993 by the American Library Association's Notable Document List as a comprehensive reference source with respect to media data, particularly from developing countries. The third edition of the World Media Handbook will be published in 1995, as a commemorative issue of the fiftieth anniversary of the United Nations. Prompted by that important occasion, the publication will contain a section entitled "Membership in brief", dealing with each Member State's participation in the work of the Organization.

(c) United Nations Film and Video Catalogue

28. This is a biennial illustrated reference book which has been published since 1947 to promote the film and video productions of the Department. It provides succinct information and data on available films, videos, photographs and archival film footage as well as a comprehensive listing of United Nations regional audiovisual libraries in 130 countries. Its audience is composed of national and private TV broadcasters, cable-TV operators, satellite networks, commercial distributors, educational institutions, government offices, NGOs and private individuals. The 1995 edition is bilingual (English and French) with a print run of 10,000 copies, together with 2,000 corresponding posters. The publication is not a sales item. Coordinated efforts with international broadcasting unions and the use of satellite transmission have also been effective in promoting and distributing United Nations audiovisual programmes.

## II. NON-RECURRENT PUBLICATIONS

29. In view of the evolving mandate of the United Nations in the fields of economic and social development, peace-keeping and peacemaking, human rights and humanitarian assistance, the availability of print materials for public information is an increasingly crucial aspect of the promotion of an informed understanding and effective support for the work of the United Nations. Special emphasis is on documenting the achievements of the United Nations in major areas of common concern to the Member States. With this in mind, the Department has continued to issue thematic publications related to the preparation of and follow-up to major United Nations conferences, to peace-keeping and other political missions in the field, as well as to human rights and related issues.

30. The Department of Public Information continued in 1994 to focus its publications on the issues stemming from the decade's cycle of major development-related United Nations conferences. These include: the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development (1992), the World Conference on Human Rights (1993), the Global Conference on the Sustainable Development of Small Island Developing States (1994), the World Conference on Natural Disaster Reduction (1994), the International Conference on Population and Development (1994), the World Summit for Social Development (1995), the Fourth World Conference on Women (1995) and the United Nations Conference on Human Settlements (Habitat II) (1996).

31. The Department has sought to build upon and strengthen world interest in these conferences by producing a variety of publications on major global themes aimed at a wide-ranging international audience, particularly the media, NGOs and academic institutions. These publications, which have included posters, pamphlets, booklets, backgrounders and newsletters, such as Challenges for NGOs, have emphasized the mutually reinforcing themes of all these conferences, often within the overall context of the commemoration of the fiftieth anniversary of the United Nations. Regular contacts are maintained and meetings held with relevant departments and offices, including through the interdepartmental and inter-agency task forces established for the Social Summit and the Conference on Women, to ensure that these publications reflect priority themes.

32. In early February 1995, the Department published and distributed, primarily as sales items, An Agenda for Development, which included two reports of the Secretary-General on the subject and relevant General Assembly and Economic and Social Council documents; and his An Agenda for Peace, second edition, with the New Supplement and Related Documents and relevant General Assembly and Security Council documents. Both publications have been issued in English (10,000 copies), French and Spanish (4,000 copies each) and Arabic, Chinese and Russian (2,000 copies each).

33. In view of the fact that United Nations peace-keeping and peacemaking activities have continued to be a dominant focus of world media coverage of the Organization, reflecting the wider public concern over the many conflicts around the world, the Department issued 14 backgrounders and information notes on United Nations peace-keeping operations in 1994. The publications had as their aim to promote better understanding of these complex efforts by the United Nations and were produced in close cooperation with the Department of Peace-keeping Operations, the Department of Political Affairs and other substantive offices concerned. In addition, on the occasion of the fiftieth anniversary of the Organization, as called for by the General Assembly in its resolution 49/37, the Department has begun work on the third edition of The Blue Helmets, its comprehensive review of the peace-keeping and peacemaking operations of the United Nations since 1948. It is scheduled for publication in October 1995.

34. In accordance with relevant General Assembly resolutions, the Department issues publications intended to raise the awareness of the international community on the question of Palestine and the situation of the Middle East in general, including the achievements of the peace process. During 1994, the Department published the books: The United Nations and the Question of

Palestine, Promoting a Culture for Peace in the Middle East, as well as the backgrounder Prerequisites for Peace in the Middle East.

35. As part of its primary responsibility for public information activities built around the World Public Information Campaign for Human Rights and the follow-up to the World Conference on Human Rights held at Vienna in 1993, the Department reprinted and distributed essential publications on human rights, including backgrounders on human rights and culture and on indigenous people. In relation to the International Year of the World's Indigenous People (1993) and the International Decade of the World's Indigenous People (1994-2003), in particular, the Department released a special booklet, entitled Seeds of a New Partnership: Indigenous People and the United Nations. Two editions of a press kit on the International Year of the Family (1994) were also widely distributed.

36. The programme of non-recurrent publications of the Dag Hammarskjöld Library includes the brochure DHL Services (in Arabic, Chinese, English, French and Spanish; the Russian version will be made available by mid-1995); the Depository Libraries Manual, containing a brief guide to the United Nations documentation; Instructions for Depository Libraries; and United Nations Documentation: Selected List of Reference Sources. These publications are released in the six official languages. In addition, mini-catalogues and other special materials for user departments as well as back-of-the-book indexes have been provided upon request.

### III. OTHER ACTIVITIES

37. The Assistant Secretary-General for Public Information was appointed Chairman of the Publications Board in 1994. The Department, through its Production and Coordination Section, monitors publications products and processes work assigned to Conference Services. Methods of production, print-run figures, page units, and starting and completion dates for work orders processed internally or externally are researched and subjected to regular review. Project managers for print products are provided with preliminary cost estimates obtained from price lists, commercial price guides or from vendors. This policy has contributed to more cost-effective planning and production of publications, as well as avoiding duplication of publications, bearing in mind that Secretariat-wide, 1,161 print projects covering 39 programmes were requested for implementation in 1994.

38. Furthermore, the Department is making particular efforts to upgrade its technology in order to speed up the production and improve the quality of its print output. This would contribute to a substantial improvement in the implementation of its publications programme.

39. United Nations information centres and services in 1994 made further efforts to repackage, adapt and disseminate to their audiences United Nations information material in print in non-official, local languages. Statements by the Secretary-General, as well as booklets, fact-sheets and backgrounders related to the International Conference on Population and Development, the World Summit for Social Development and the Fourth World Conference on Women have been produced in Bahasa Indonesian, Danish, Dutch, Finnish, German, Hindi, Hungarian,

Icelandic, Italian, Kiswahili, Nepali, Norwegian, Portuguese, Romanian, Shona, Swedish and Thai. The United Nations Charter and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights as well as major publications such as the Report of the Secretary-General on the Work of the Organization have been made available by information centres, with the assistance of national partners, in additional languages, including Czech, German, Greek, Japanese and Portuguese. The United Nations information centre in Windhoek has produced the United Nations Charter and the International Bill of Human Rights in Afrikaans and in Oshivambo. Currently, a Portuguese version of the Secretary-General's An Agenda for Peace, second edition, with the New Supplement and Related Documents, as well as his Agenda for Development are being produced for distribution in Portuguese-speaking countries.

40. The Department stepped up its ongoing efforts to maximize the timeliness and usefulness of the information it disseminates through print by making it immediately available by electronic means to over 200 United Nations offices including United Nations information centres and services as well as United Nations field offices throughout the world. It continued to disseminate information in print and electronic form to over 1,000 organizations, particularly the media. In order to reach the targeted audience, the Department has developed a system of multiple mailing lists, both at Headquarters and United Nations information centres and services. In the light of budgetary constraints which impede the Department's ability to increase the print runs of popular publications, the Department is now disseminating more of its products through international information networks, including the Internet, APC, TogetherNet and Agora.

41. The Department, through its External Publications Office, in 1994 used its best efforts in making United Nations print products available to the widest possible audiences through joint cooperation with commercial publishers. It must be noted that external publishing houses are often in a better position to publish, reprint, translate and disseminate United Nations books or reports (in both printed and other formats). As mentioned above, the Yearbook of the United Nations is being published externally by Martinus Nijhoff, the Netherlands, as is UNBIS Plus on CD-ROM, which is being produced by Chadwyck-Healey, United Kingdom. Publications of the Department continued to be of interest to publishers world wide and negotiations for language rights to its products such as Basic Facts (Japanese) and An Agenda for Peace (Korean) were successfully concluded in 1994. A number of other proposals are also under consideration, such as the production of pocketbook versions of the Blue Book Series, as well as the production of Basic Facts and the fiftieth anniversary edition of the Yearbook of the United Nations in Russian.

42. Publications of the Department are generally distributed free of charge to United Nations information centres and services, regional commissions and other United Nations offices in the field, representatives of intergovernmental organizations, non-governmental organizations, media and research organizations, United Nations depository libraries and government offices. They are also sent to permanent and observer missions at Headquarters.

43. The Department, in the pursuit of its mandate to produce topical information for the widest possible dissemination, also produces publications of

a more enduring nature. These publications are generally more marketable, which potentially allows the United Nations to recover production costs to the fullest extent possible. The volumes of the Blue Book Series would fall into this category, as do a number of the Department's recurrent publications, including: Yearbook of the United Nations, World Media Handbook, UN Chronicle, Basic Facts about the United Nations and Everyone's United Nations. Currently, the Department is undertaking additional efforts with the assistance of its network of United Nations information centres and services to identify those publications that have a strong demand among its audiences, and to make those publications sales items. A list of distributors of United Nations publications is contained in annex II to the present report.

44. The review of these publications and their mandates is normally undertaken by the Department of Public Information in the context of the preparation of the Secretary-General's proposed programme budget. During each biennium, the Assistant Secretary-General for Public Information, together with senior project managers, carries out a review of all proposals for publications on a continual basis. In the course of that process, careful attention is given to avoid possible duplication of information already available in publications produced elsewhere, both inside and outside the United Nations system.
