Joint declaration by the European Union and the United States  
of America on the elections in Albania, issued on 17 May 1996

The European Union and the United States take note of the upcoming parliamentary elections in Albania as a further step in the democratic progress of the country, which is a matter of substantial importance to the parties in the transatlantic dialogue. They appreciate the role that Albanian institutions and Albanian political parties are playing in this context. The European Union and the United States call upon all parties concerned to approach the elections mindful of their common interest in consolidating democracy in a pluralistic society and a free market economy. The European Union and the United States specifically call upon all parties concerned to create general conditions that allow for a free and fair election process. The European Union and the United States stand ready to assist in this effort and to observe the campaign and election process in order that the will of the people may be effectively expressed by the vote.
