2.	16.08.95 to 30.09.95	Petition entitled "World Campaign for the Abolition of Nuclear Weapons", signed by 500 individuals in France, transmitted by the International Peace Bureau (Geneva).
3.	16.09.95	Text of a "Draft Convention on the Monitoring and Reduction of Arms Transfers, Stockpiling and Production" and a position paper entitled "Weapons, Wars and Deaths: a Problematique" transmitted by the World Order Models Project, New York.
4.	29.09.95	Text of "Resolution Calling for a Comprehensive Ban on Nuclear Testing" adopted by the National Assembly of the Republic of Korea on 18 September 1995, transmitted by the Secretary-General of the National Assembly of the Republic of Korea.
5.	2.10.95	Communication from Mr. Enrico Vinci, Secretary-General of the European Parliament, transmitting a "Resolution on the resumption of nuclear tests by France".
6.	23.10.95	Petition entitled "Appeal from Hiroshima and Nagasaki" containing 7,195,266 signatures calling for a CTBT and the elimination of nuclear weapons, transmitted by the National Confederation of Trade Unions in Tokyo.
7.	9.11.95	Petition entitled "Peace and Disarmament" containing 130 signatures transmitted by "Union des femmes Guadeloupéennes".
8.	12.12.95	Communication received from Ms. Claire Radford, Wellington, New Zealand, transmitting a video tape and petitions signed by: staff and students of Wellington College of Education; school children from Central Wellington; and, French citizens from Paris, Lyon, Strasbourg and Marseille, calling for nuclear disarmament and an end to nuclear testing, and expressing support for the work of the Conference on Disarmament.
