REPORT OF THE INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC ENERGY AGENCY

Appointment of members of the Preparatory Committee for the
United Nations Conference for the Promotion of International
Co-operation in the Peaceful Uses of Nuclear Energy

Note by the Secretary-General

1. In paragraph 3 of resolution 35/112 of 5 December 1980, the General Assembly decided to establish a Preparatory Committee for the United Nations Conference for the Promotion of International Co-operation in the Peaceful Uses of Nuclear Energy, composed of 70 Member States and, on an equal footing, other Member States which might express their interest in participating in the work of the Committee, and requested the President of the Assembly to appoint the members of the Committee, in accordance with the principle of equitable geographical representation, not later than 1 July 1981.
2. In this connexion, the Secretary-General has received the following communication, dated 1 July 1981, from the President of the General Assembly:

"I have the honour to inform you that, in accordance with General Assembly resolution 35/112, I have held consultations with the chairmen of the regional groups with a view to appointing the 70 members of the Preparatory Committee for the United Nations Conference for the Promotion of International Co-operation in the Peaceful Uses of Nuclear Energy as prescribed in that resolution.

"Inasmuch as some of the regional groups have not yet been able to submit a sufficient number of candidates, I have appointed the following 51 States as members of the Committee, on the understanding that I will appoint any further candidates once they have been endorsed by their respective groups:
