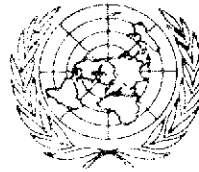

Appointment of the members of the Advisory Committee for the
World Assembly on Aging

Note by the Secretary-General

1. The Secretary-General has received the following communication, dated 13 August 1981, from the Chairman of the Third Committee:

"Further to my communication of 30 June 1981, the President of the thirty-fifth session of the General Assembly has transmitted to me a communication dated 4 August 1981 from the Permanent Representative of the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan to the United Nations, addressed to the President of the thirty-fifth session, informing him that the Asian Group, at its meeting held on 28 July 1981, had endorsed the candidacy of the Philippines for the Advisory Committee for the World Assembly on Aging.

"I would, therefore, appreciate your adding the name of the Philippines to the list of member States of the Advisory Committee for the World Assembly on Aging, contained in document A/35/806, paragraph 2.

"Your co-operation in making the necessary arrangements to advise the Government of the Philippines of this appointment will be highly appreciated.
