LETTER DATED 2 JULY 1996 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF LUXEMBOURG TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE
SECRETARY-GENERAL

On instructions from my Government, I have the honour to inform you of the measures taken by the Government of Luxembourg pursuant to paragraph 3 of resolution 1054 (1996) of 26 April 1996, imposing diplomatic sanctions on the Sudan:

The Government of Luxembourg has taken steps to restrict the entry into and transit through the territory of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg of members of the Government of the Sudan, officials of that Government and members of the Sudanese armed forces.

At the request of the Government of Luxembourg, the diplomatic staff of the Sudanese Embassy accredited to Luxembourg (residing in Belgium) will be reduced from five to four.

The Government of Luxembourg has taken measures to require prior authorization by the diplomatic staff of the Sudanese Embassy for any entry into or travel within the territory of Luxembourg.
