REPORT OF THE ORGANIZATIONAL SESSION OF THE AD HOC COMMITTEE

#### I. INTRODUCTION

1. In its resolution 50/160 of 22 December 1995 on the implementation of the United Nations New Agenda for the Development of Africa in the 1990s, the General Assembly decided, <u>inter alia</u>, to convene an organizational session of the Ad Hoc Committee of the Whole for the mid-term review of the implementation of the New Agenda to consider and adopt the necessary arrangements for its work.

#### II. ORGANIZATIONAL MATTERS

# A. Opening and duration of the session

- 2. The Ad Hoc Committee held an organizational session, comprising one meeting, at Headquarters on 20 June 1996.
- 3. The meeting was opened and chaired by Mr. Alex Reyn, Permanent Representative of Belgium to the United Nations, in his capacity as Vice-President of the fiftieth session of the General Assembly. Following the adoption of the agenda, the Chairperson read a message from the President of the General Assembly. Mr. Nitin Desai, Under-Secretary-General for Policy Coordination and Sustainable Development, made a statement. Statements were also made by the Chairman of the African Group,

Mr. Machirenyika Tabias Mapurenga (Zimbabwe), and Mr. Alberto Colella (Italy) on behalf of the European Union.

10. The Ad Hoc Committee decided to defer the election of Rapporteur to its forthcoming session in September 1996.

# E. Organization of work

#### Working groups

- 11. The Ad Hoc Committee decided to establish the following two working groups:
- (a) Working Group I on the assessment of national efforts based on relevant inputs from African countries;
- (b) Working Group II on the response of the international community including the United Nations system, and the necessary measures to accelerate and improve the implementation of the New Agenda.

# <u>Documentation</u>

- 12. The Ad Hoc Committee took note of the documentation that would be made available for the conduct of the mid-term review. It would include a report of the Secretary-General, a major component of which would be submitted by ECA regarding actions taken and progress achieved by African countries in the implementation of the New Agenda, and inputs from members of the United Nations Inter-Agency Task Force on African Economic Recovery and Development. The documentation would also include an assessment and recommendations by OAU on the implementation of the New Agenda. The Ad Hoc Committee strongly recommended that the documents be made available in all languages by 31 July 1996.
- 13. Additional background/information documents would also be made available to the Ad Hoc Committee on the seminar on the implementation of the New Agenda, to

be held at Tokyo on 27 and 28 August 1996, on the emerging role of non-governmental organizations in African sustainable development, and on resource requirements for the full implementation of the New Agenda.

# Participation of non-governmental organizations

14. The Ad Hoc Committee decided to grant maximum participation to non-governmental organizations in consultative status with the Economic and Social Council and other non-governmental organizations that had been contributing to the implementation of the New Agenda, in conformity with established rules and accepted practices. In particular, the non-governmental organizations would be allowed to be present in formal meetings, but would not be engaged in the negotiating process. The Secretariat would maintain liaison with the Bureau of the Ad Hoc Committee on that matter.

#### Date of the mid-term review

15. The Ad Hoc Committee decided to conduct the mid-term review starting from 16 September 1996. To that end, it decided to recommend to the General Assembly at its fiftieth session that the Ad Hoc Committee meet during the Assembly's fifty-first session and, for that purpose, to recommend that the mandate of the Ad Hoc Committee for the period set out in paragraph 6 of General Assembly resolution 50/160 be extended.

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
