LETTER DATED 23 FEBRUARY 1979 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVES
OF AUSTRALIA, CANADA AND NEW ZEALAND TO THE UNITED NATIONS
ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL
