SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS  
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE  
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/1996/15 of 11 January 1996, S/1996/15/Add.4 of 9 February 1996, S/1996/15/Add.8 of 8 March 1996, S/1996/15/Add.14 of 19 April 1996 and S/1996/15/Add.18 of 17 May 1996.

During the week ending 27 July 1996, the Security Council took action on the following item:

The situation in Burundi (see S/25070/Add.43, S/25070/Add.46, S/1994/20/Add.29, S/1994/20/Add.33, S/1994/20/Add.41, S/1994/20/Add.50, S/1995/40/Add.4, S/1995/40/Add.9, S/1995/40/Add.12, S/1995/40/Add.34, S/1996/15, S/1996/15/Add.4, S/1996/15/Add.9, S/1996/15/Add.16 and S/1996/15/Add.19)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3682nd meeting, held on 24 July 1996, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the letter dated 22 July 1996 from the Security Council addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/1996/591).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Burundi, at his request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President stated that, following consultations of the Council, he had been authorized to make a statement on behalf of the Council and read out the text of that statement (for the text, see S/PRST/1996/31; to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-first Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1996).

Shooting down of two civil aircraft on 24 February 1996 (see S/1996/15/Add.8)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 3683rd meeting, held on 26 July 1996, in accordance with the understanding reached in its prior consultations, having before it the note by the Secretary-General (S/1996/509).

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Colombia, Cuba, the Lao People's Democratic Republic and Viet Nam, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

The President drew attention to the text of a draft resolution (S/1996/596) that had been submitted by the United States of America.

The Security Council proceeded to vote on draft resolution S/1996/596, which received 13 votes in favour, to none against, with two abstentions (China and the Russian Federation) and was adopted as resolution 1067 (1996) (for the text, see S/RES/1067 (1996); to be issued in Official Records of the Security Council, Fifty-first Year, Resolutions and Decisions of the Security Council, 1996).
