Niger, Tunisia and Uganda: draft resolution

The Security Council,

<u>Convinced</u> of the need to have appropriate machinery in order to examine the progress of the implementation of the measures envisaged in resolutions (1981),

Recalling its resolutions (1981) on comprehensive mandatory sanctions against South Africa on the question of Namibia,

<u>Noting</u> that it requested the Secretary-General to report to the Council on the progress of the implementation of resolutions _____ (1981),

1. <u>Decides</u> to establish, in accordance with rule 28 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, a committee of the Security Council, provided with powers and means commensurate with its responsibilities, to undertake the following tasks and to report to it with its observations:

(a) To seek from any State information relevant to the strict implementation of these resolutions including any activities by any nationals of that State or in its territories that may constitute an evasion of the provisions of this resolution;

(b) To examine such reports on the implementation of the above resolutions as may be submitted by the Secretary-General;

2. <u>Calls</u> upon all States to co-operate fully with the Committee in regard to the fulfilment of its tasks concerning the effective implementation of the provisions of resolutions (1981) and to supply such information as may be sought by the Committee in pursuance of the present resolution;

3. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to provide every assistance to the Committee established in accordance with rule 28 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council in the implementation of its mandate.
