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CHAPTER VII

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION ON THE GRANTING OF INDEPENDENCE TO COLONIAL COUNTRIES AND PEOPLES BY THE SPECIALIZED AGENCIES AND THE INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTIONS ASSOCIATED WITH THE UNITED NATIONS

A. Consideration by the Special Committee

1. At its 1454th meeting, on 16 February 1996, by adopting the suggestions relating to the organization of its work put forward by the Chairman (A/AC.109/L.1841), the Special Committee decided, <u>inter alia</u>, to take up as a separate item the question of the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples by the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations and to consider it at its plenary meetings.

2. The Special Committee considered the item at its 1465th meeting, on 1 August 1996.

3. In its consideration of the item, the Special Committee took into account the provisions of General Assembly resolution 50/34 of 6 December 1995, on the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples by the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations, in paragraph 17 of which the Assembly requested the Committee to continue to examine the question and to report thereon to the Assembly at its fifty-first session. The Committee also took into account all other resolutions adopted by the Assembly on this subject, including resolution 46/181 of 19 December 1991, endorsing the Plan of Action for the International Decade for the Eradication of Colonialism.

4. The Special Committee also took into account the provisions of Economic and Social Council resolution 1996/37, adopted at the Council's 51st plenary meeting, on 26 July 1996. In paragraph 15 of that resolution, the Council drew the attention of the Special Committee to the resolution and to the discussion held on the subject at the Council's substantive session of 1996 (see E/1996/SR.44). Further, the Committee took into consideration the relevant documents of other intergovernmental bodies concerned, to which reference is made in the fourth preambular paragraph of the resolution it adopted on 1 August (see paras. 12 and 15 below).

5. During its consideration of the item, the Special Committee had before it a report of the Secretary-General (A/51/212), submitted in response to the request addressed to him by the General Assembly in paragraph 16 of resolution 50/34, containing information on action taken by organizations of the United Nations system in implementation of the resolutions of the United Nations referred to above.

6. At the 1465th meeting, on 1 August, the Acting Chairman reported orally on his participation, on behalf of the Special Committee, in the work of the Economic and Social Council in connection with its consideration of the item during the Council's substantive session for 1996 (see A/AC.109/SR.1465).

7. At the same meeting, the Acting Chairman drew the Special Committee's attention to the relevant documentation, including the report on the related consultations with the President of the Economic and Social Council under the

terms of paragraph 14 of General Assembly resolution 50/34 (A/AC.109/L.1853 and E/1996/85), as well as to a draft resolution submitted by him (A/AC.109/L.1854).

8. At its 1461st meeting, on 24 July, the Special Committee granted a request for hearing to Mr. Carlyle Corbin, United Nations Association of the Virgin Islands. Mr. Corbin made a statement at the 1465th meeting (see A/AC.109/SR.1465). In the ensuing discussion, the statements were made by the representative of the Syrian Arab Republic and by the Acting Chairman (see A/AC.109/SR.1465).

9. The representative of the Russian Federation made a statement in explanation of the position of his Government on the draft resolution (see A/AC.109/SR.1465).

10. The representative of Côte d'Ivoire requested clarification with regard to the French text of the draft resolution.

11. At the same meeting, the representative of Cuba proposed an oral amendment to draft resolution A/AC.109/L.1854, by which, at the end of the fifth preambular paragraph, the words "contained in General Assembly resolution 1514 (XV)" would be added.

12. The representative of the Russian Federation made a statement on a point of clarification in response to a question posed to him by the representative of Cuba.

13. The Special Committee then adopted draft resolution A/AC.109/L.1854, as orally amended, without a vote.

14. On 12 August, the text of the resolution (A/AC.109/2070) was transmitted to all States and to the Organization of African Unity (OAU), the South Pacific Forum, the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) and the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system.

B. Decision of the Special Committee

15. The text of the resolution (A/AC.109/2070) adopted by the Special Committee at its 1465th meeting, on 1 August 1996 (see para. 12), is reproduced in section C below, in the form of a recommendation of the Special Committee to the General Assembly.

C. Recommendation of the Special Committee

16. In accordance with decisions taken at its 1454th and 1465th meetings, on 16 February and 1 August 1996, respectively, the Special Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution: Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples by the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations

The General Assembly,

<u>Having considered</u> the item entitled "Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples by the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations",

<u>Having also considered</u> the reports submitted on the item by the Secretary-General $\underline{1}$ / and the Chairman of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, $\underline{2}$ /

<u>Having examined</u> the chapter of the report of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples relating to the item, $\underline{3}/$

<u>Recalling</u> its resolutions 1514 (XV) of 14 December 1960 and 1541 (XV) of 15 December 1960, and resolutions of the Special Committee, as well as other relevant resolutions and decisions of the United Nations,

<u>Bearing in mind</u> the relevant provisions of the final documents of the successive Conferences of Heads of State or Government of Non-Aligned Countries and of the resolutions adopted by the Assembly of Heads of State and Government of the Organization of African Unity, the South Pacific Forum and the Caribbean Community,

 $\underline{Conscious}$ of the need to facilitate the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples contained in its resolution 1514 (XV),

<u>Noting</u> that the large majority of the remaining Non-Self-Governing Territories are small island Territories,

<u>Welcoming</u> the assistance extended to Non-Self-Governing Territories by certain specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system, in particular the United Nations Development Programme,

<u>Stressing</u> that, because the development options of small island Non-Self-Governing Territories are limited, there are special challenges to planning for and implementing sustainable development and that those Territories will be constrained in meeting the challenges without the continued cooperation and assistance of the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system,

<u>Stressing also</u> the importance of securing necessary resources for funding expanded assistance programmes for the peoples concerned and the need to enlist the support of all major funding institutions within the United Nations system in that regard,

<u>Reaffirming</u> the mandates of the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system to take all the appropriate measures,

within their respective spheres of competence, to ensure the full implementation of resolution 1514 (XV) and other relevant resolutions,

Expressing its appreciation to the Organization of African Unity, the South Pacific Forum and the Caribbean Community, as well as other regional organizations, for the continued cooperation and assistance they have extended to the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system in this regard,

Expressing its conviction that closer contacts and consultations between and among the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system and regional organizations help to facilitate the effective formulation of assistance programmes to the peoples concerned,

<u>Mindful</u> of the imperative need to keep under continuous review the activities of the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system in the implementation of the various United Nations decisions relating to decolonization,

<u>Bearing in mind</u> the extremely fragile economies of the Non-Self-Governing small island Territories and their vulnerability to natural disasters, such as hurricanes, cyclones and sea-level rise, and recalling its relevant resolutions,

<u>Recalling</u> its resolution 50/34 of 6 December 1995 on the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples by the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations,

1. <u>Takes note</u> of the report of the Chairman of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples on his consultations with the President of the Economic and Social Council 2/ and endorses the observations and suggestions arising therefrom; 4/

2. <u>Recommends</u> that all States intensify their efforts in the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system to ensure implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples and other relevant resolutions of the United Nations;

3. <u>Reaffirms</u> that the specialized agencies and other organizations and institutions of the United Nations system should continue to be guided by the relevant resolutions of the United Nations in their efforts to contribute to the implementation of the Declaration and all other relevant General Assembly resolutions;

4. <u>Reaffirms also</u> that the recognition by the General Assembly and other United Nations organs of the legitimacy of the aspiration of the peoples of Non-Self-Governing Territories to exercise their right to self-determination entails, as a corollary, the extension of all appropriate assistance to those peoples;

5. <u>Expresses its appreciation</u> to those specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system that have continued to cooperate with the United Nations and the regional and subregional organizations in the implementation of resolution 1514 (XV) and other relevant resolutions of the United Nations;

6. <u>Requests</u> the specialized agencies and the international institutions associated with the United Nations, as well as regional organizations, to examine and review conditions in each Territory so as to take appropriate measures to accelerate progress in the economic and social sectors of the Territories and strengthen existing measures of support, and to formulate appropriate programmes of assistance to the remaining Non-Self-Governing Territories, within the framework of their respective mandates, in order to accelerate progress in the economic and social sectors of those Territories;

7. <u>Recommends</u> that the executive heads of the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system formulate, with the active cooperation of the regional organizations concerned, concrete proposals for the full implementation of the relevant resolutions of the United Nations and submit the proposals to their governing and legislative organs;

8. <u>Also recommends</u> that the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system continue to review at the regular meetings of their governing bodies the implementation of resolution 1514 (XV) and other relevant resolutions of the United Nations;

9. <u>Welcomes</u> the continuing initiative exercised by the United Nations Development Programme in maintaining close liaison among the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations and in providing assistance to the peoples of Non-Self-Governing Territories;

10. <u>Encourages</u> Non-Self-Governing Territories to take steps to establish and/or strengthen disaster preparedness and management institutions and policies;

11. <u>Requests</u> the administering Powers concerned to facilitate the participation of appointed and elected representatives of Non-Self-Governing Territories in the relevant meetings and conferences of the agencies and organizations so that the Territories may benefit from the related activities of the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system;

12. <u>Recommends</u> that all Governments intensify their efforts in the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system of which they are members to ensure the full and effective implementation of resolution 1514 (XV) and other relevant resolutions of the United Nations and, in that connection, accord priority to the question of providing assistance to the peoples of the Non-Self-Governing Territories;

13. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to continue to assist the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system in working out appropriate measures for implementing the relevant resolutions of the United Nations and to prepare for submission to the relevant bodies, with the assistance of those agencies and organizations, a report on the action taken in implementation of the relevant resolutions, including the present resolution, since the circulation of his previous report;

14. <u>Commends</u> the Economic and Social Council for its debate <u>5</u>/ and its resolution 1996/37 of 26 July 1996 on this issue, and requests it to continue to consider, in consultation with the Special Committee, appropriate measures for coordination of the policies and activities of the specialized agencies and other organizations of the United Nations system in implementing the relevant resolutions of the General Assembly;

15. <u>Requests</u> the specialized agencies to report periodically to the Secretary-General on the implementation of the present resolution;

16. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to transmit the present resolution to the governing bodies of the appropriate specialized agencies and international institutions associated with the United Nations so that those bodies take the necessary measures to implement the resolution, and also requests the Secretary-General to report to the General Assembly at its fifty-second session on the implementation of the present resolution;

17. <u>Requests</u> the Special Committee to continue to examine the question and to report thereon to the General Assembly at its fifty-second session.

CHAPTER VIII

INFORMATION FROM NON-SELF-GOVERNING TERRITORIES TRANSMITTED UNDER ARTICLE 73 e OF THE CHARTER OF THE UNITED NATIONS

A. Consideration by the Special Committee

1. At its 1454th meeting, on 16 February 1996, by adopting the suggestions relating to the organization of its work put forward by the Chairman (A/AC.109/L.1841), the Special Committee decided, <u>inter alia</u>, to take up the question of information from Non-Self-Governing Territories transmitted under Article 73 \underline{e} of the Charter of the United Nations as a separate item and to consider it at its plenary meetings.

2. The Special Committee considered the item at its 1456th meeting, on 22 July 1996.

3. In its consideration of the item, the Special Committee took into account the resolutions of the General Assembly concerning information from Non-Self-Governing Territories transmitted under Article 73 e of the Charter of the United Nations and related questions, in particular resolution 1970 (XVIII) of 16 December 1963, by which the Assembly decided, inter alia, to dissolve the Committee on Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories and to transfer certain of its functions to the Special Committee, and paragraph 5 of resolution 50/32 of 6 December 1995, in which the Assembly requested the Committee to continue to discharge the functions entrusted to it under Assembly resolution 1970 (XVIII), in accordance with established procedures, and to report thereon to the Assembly at its fifty-first session. Further, the Committee took into account the relevant provisions of Assembly resolutions 50/39 of 6 December 1995, on the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, and 45/33 of 20 November 1990, relating to the thirtieth anniversary of the Declaration.

4. At the 1456th meeting, on 22 July, the Acting Chairman drew the Special Committee's attention to draft resolution A/AC.109/L.1845 on the item.

5. At the same meeting, following statements by the representatives of Indonesia and Portugal (see A/AC.109/SR.1456), the Special Committee adopted draft resolution A/AC.109/L.1845 without a vote.

6. On 1 August, the text of the resolution (A/AC.109/2061) was transmitted to the representatives of the administering Powers for the attention of their Governments.

B. Decision of the Special Committee

7. The text of the resolution (A/AC.109/2061), adopted by the Special Committee at its 1456th meeting, on 22 July 1996 (see para. 5), appears in section C below, in the form of a recommendation of the Special Committee to the General Assembly.

C. Recommendation of the Special Committee

8. In accordance with decisions taken at its 1454th and 1456th meetings, on 16 February and 22 July 1996, respectively, the Special Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

<u>Information from Non-Self-Governing Territories transmitted</u> under Article 73 e of the Charter of the United Nations

The General Assembly,

<u>Having examined</u> the chapter of the report of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples relating to the information from Non-Self-Governing Territories transmitted under Article 73 \underline{e} of the Charter of the United Nations $\underline{1}$ / and the action taken by the Special Committee in respect of that information,

<u>Having also examined</u> the report of the Secretary-General on the item, 2/

<u>Recalling</u> its resolution 1970 (XVIII) of 16 December 1963, in which it requested the Special Committee to study the information transmitted to the Secretary-General in accordance with Article 73 \underline{e} of the Charter and to take such information fully into account in examining the situation with regard to the implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples, contained in its resolution 1514 (XV) of 14 December 1960,

<u>Recalling also</u> its resolution 50/32 of 6 December 1995, in which it requested the Special Committee to continue to discharge the functions entrusted to it under resolution 1970 (XVIII),

<u>Stressing</u> the importance of timely transmission by the administering Powers of adequate information under Article 73 \underline{e} of the Charter, in particular in relation to the preparation by the Secretariat of the working papers on the Territories concerned,

1. <u>Approves</u> the chapter of the report of the Special Committee on the Situation with regard to the Implementation of the Declaration on the Granting of Independence to Colonial Countries and Peoples relating to the information from Non-Self-Governing Territories transmitted under Article 73 <u>e</u> of the Charter of the United Nations; $\underline{1}/$

2. <u>Reaffirms</u> that, in the absence of a decision by the General Assembly itself that a Non-Self-Governing Territory has attained a full measure of self-government in terms of Chapter XI of the Charter, the administering Power concerned should continue to transmit information under Article 73 <u>e</u> of the Charter with respect to that Territory;

3. <u>Requests</u> the administering Powers concerned to transmit or continue to transmit to the Secretary-General the information prescribed in Article 73 <u>e</u> of the Charter, as well as the fullest possible information on political and constitutional developments in the Territories concerned, within a maximum period of six months following the expiration of the administrative year in those Territories;

4. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to continue to ensure that adequate information is drawn from all available published sources in connection with the preparation of the working papers relating to the Territories concerned;

5. <u>Requests</u> the Special Committee to continue to discharge the functions entrusted to it under resolution 1970 (XVIII), in accordance with established procedures, and to report thereon to the General Assembly at its fifty-second session.
