I. INTRODUCTION

1. The annual report of the Secretary-General on the composition of the Secretariat is submitted in accordance with a number of resolutions of the General Assembly, the most recent of which are resolutions 45/239 A of 21 December 1990, 47/226 of 30 April 1993 and 49/222 of 23 December 1994. The purpose of the report is to facilitate an assessment of the distribution of the staff of the United Nations Secretariat by nationality, sex, grade and type of appointment, in the light of the principles contained in the Charter of the United Nations and the guidelines set forth by the General Assembly.
2. The information is provided mainly in the statistical tables inserted throughout its text as well as in those contained in annex I. In addition, detailed information on staff members can be found in the list of staff of the United Nations Secretariat as of 31 August 1996.
3. Information concerning women at the United Nations can also be found in the report of the Secretary-General on the improvement of the status of women in the United Nations Secretariat. A number of statistical tables contained in the present report are also reproduced in that report to facilitate the consideration of the question of women on the basis of a single comprehensive report in accordance with the views expressed by Member States during the deliberations on the subject in the Third and Fifth Committees.

II. COMPOSITION OF THE SECRETARIAT

A. Staff of the United Nations

4. The power of the Secretary-General to appoint staff derives from Article 101, paragraph 1, of the Charter of the United Nations, which states:

"The staff shall be appointed by the Secretary-General under regulations established by the General Assembly."
5. There are a number of subsidiary organs of the United Nations that enjoy special status granted by the General Assembly concerning the appointment of their staff: United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF); United Nations Development Programme (UNDP); Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR); United Nations Relief and Works Agency for Palestine Refugees in the Near East (UNRWA); United Nations University (UNU); secretariat of the International Civil Service Commission (ICSC); Registry of the International Court of Justice (ICJ); and International Trade Centre (ITC).

Total staff of the United Nations

6. The total number of staff of the United Nations as of 30 June 1996 was 33,157 (see fig. 1), of whom 14,166 were assigned to the Secretariat of the United Nations and 18,991 to the secretariats of United Nations subsidiary organs. As regards funding, 9,196 staff occupy posts financed from the regular budget and 25,749 posts financed from extrabudgetary sources. Further details



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Principles governing the recruitment and employment of staff

7. The principles governing the recruitment and employment of staff are derived from Article 101, paragraph 3, of the Charter, which states:

"The paramount consideration in the employment of the staff and in the determination of the conditions of service shall be the necessity of securing the highest standards of efficiency, competence, and integrity. Due regard shall be paid to the importance of recruiting the staff on as wide a geographical basis as possible."

8. These principles apply to all the staff of the United Nations, including the staff of the secretariats of subsidiary organs with special status in matters of appointment (see para. 5 above).

B. Posts subject to geographical distribution

9. A particular group of staff of the United Nations Secretariat is covered by a system of desirable ranges used as a guideline for estimating the comparative representation of the nationals of each Member State. This system has been established by the General Assembly on the basis of three factors: membership, contribution and population. The staff concerned are referred to as "staff in posts subject to geographical distribution". The special characteristic of this group of staff, who currently number 2,514, is that they are directly appointed by the Secretary-General for at least one year to posts in the Professional category and above.

Staff excluded from geographical distribution

10. There are a number of staff members who are excluded from the principle of geographical distribution. As mentioned in paragraph 5 above, the largest group is composed of staff who do not serve in the United Nations Secretariat but in the secretariats of subsidiary organs with special status in matters of appointment.

11. Within the Secretariat, the largest groups excluded are staff in posts with special language requirements, staff in the Field Service and the categories of locally recruited staff related to the General Service categories (such as Trades and Crafts, Security and Safety and Public Information Assistants). Other groups consist of staff specifically appointed for mission service; staff appointed for service limited to the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP); to the United Nations Centre for Human Settlements (UNCHS) or for the United Nations International Drug Control Programme (UNDCP); staff appointed to posts financed on an inter-agency basis; technical cooperation project personnel; and National Officers serving at United Nations information centres.

12. Also excluded are staff with appointments for less than one year; staff on special leave without pay; staff on secondment to other agencies; and staff members who are permanent residents in the country of their duty station. Information on the numbers of these groups of staff can be found in annex I, table 1.

C. Representation of Member States

13. The representation of Member States is assessed in conformity with the system of desirable ranges (see annex I, table 4A). Member States fall into four categories, resulting from the comparison of their ranges with the number of their nationals in posts subject to geographical distribution: unrepresented; underrepresented; within range; and overrepresented. 1/

14. As of 30 June 1996, there were 23 unrepresented Member States, as compared with 25 on 30 June 1995. They were: Andorra, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brunei Darussalam, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Kazakhstan, Kuwait, Kyrgyzstan, Liechtenstein, Maldives, Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Monaco, Palau, Republic of Moldova, San Marino, Sao Tome and Principe, Solomon Islands, Tajikistan, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan and Vanuatu.


15. On 30 June 1996, there were 22 underrepresented Member States, as compared with 25 on 30 June 1995. They were: Albania, Angola, Armenia, Bahrain, Belize, Comoros, Djibouti, Guinea-Bissau, Italy, Japan, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Latvia, Mozambique, Norway, Panama, Qatar, Samoa, Saudi Arabia, Slovenia, South Africa, Suriname and United Arab Emirates.

16. The changes in the representation of Member States may result not only from the appointments and separations from service of staff but also from such other factors as the adjustments of the desirable ranges resulting from an increase or decrease in the number of posts subject to geographical distribution, changes in the number of Member States and variations in the assessed contribution of individual Member States or in their population, as well as from changes in the status of some staff members (consequent upon such actions as movements between geographic and non-geographic posts, departures on secondment or special leave without pay, returns from secondment or special leave and changes of nationality).

17. The evolution in the comparative representation of Member States in geographic posts over the period from 30 June 1992 to 30 June 1996 is illustrated in figure 2.

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D. Groupings of Member States

18. In conformity with the request of the General Assembly in resolution 45/239 A, most of the tables contained in annex I to the present report are arranged first by country, in alphabetical order, and then by major geographical region. The composition of each region is shown in annex II, table A, to the report. Table B in the text shows the number of Member States in each geographical region arranged by degree of representation during the period 1992-1996.

19. Information concerning the representation of developing and other countries is shown in table C, which shows the situation each year during the five-year period from 1992 to 1996. In accordance with past practice, ad hoc desirable ranges for developing countries and other countries have been established by totalling the desirable ranges of all countries in each group.

20. The first column of text table C indicates the group and the second column the year. The third and fourth columns show the combined desirable ranges and mid-point for each group. The fifth column shows the percentage of posts corresponding to the mid-point of each group. The remaining columns show the actual numbers and the percentage of posts encumbered by nationals of countries members of the group at various levels: all staff in the Professional category and above, staff at the D-1 level and above, staff at the D-2 level and above, and staff at the assistant secretary-general level and above. The figures in parentheses show the situation of women. In estimating the representation of each group, due account is taken of the actual percentage of posts encumbered by nationals of countries in the group as compared with the percentage established by reference to the mid-point of the group's ad hoc desirable range.

E. Representation of developing and other countries among staff at the senior levels (Principal Officer (D-1) level and above)

21. In resolution 45/239 A, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General to take every available measure to ensure, at the senior and policy-formulating levels of the Secretariat, the equitable representation of Member States, in particular of developing countries and Member States with inadequate representation at those levels, in accordance with the relevant resolutions of the General Assembly, and to include relevant information in future reports on the composition of the Secretariat.

22. The representation of developing countries and other countries at the senior and policy-formulating levels during the period from 1992 to 1996 is shown in table C. More detailed information on the representation of Member States at these and other levels can be found in table 4 in annex I to the present report.

Representation in the upper echelons (assistant secretary-general and under-secretary-general)

23. In the same resolution, the General Assembly requested the Secretary-General, in order to preserve the principles of equitable geographical distribution and rotation in the upper echelons of the Secretariat (assistant secretary-general and under-secretary-general levels), to ensure that equal opportunity is given to candidates of all Member States when making appointments to all posts in the upper echelons.

24. During the period under review, nationals of Brazil, China and Ghana were appointed.

F. Representation of women

25. At its forty-sixth session, the General Assembly adopted resolution 46/100 of 16 December 1991, on the Improvement of the Status of Women in the Secretariat.

26. At its forty-fifth session, the General Assembly had adopted resolution 45/239 C of 21 December 1990 on the same subject. In that resolution, the Assembly urged the Secretary-General to continue his efforts to increase the number of women in posts subject to geographical distribution, in particular in senior policy levels and decision-making posts, in order to achieve an overall participation rate of 30 per cent by the end of 1990 and, to the extent possible, 35 per cent by 1995, taking into account the principle that the paramount consideration shall be the necessity of securing the highest standards of efficiency, competence and integrity with full respect for the principle of equitable geographical distribution.

27. In the same resolution, the Assembly also urged the Secretary-General, all things being equal and to the extent possible, to accord priority to the participation of women at the D-1 level and above with a view to increasing the

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participation rate of women in posts at the D-1 level and above to 25 per cent of the total within the overall participation rate of women in 35 per cent of posts subject to geographical distribution by 1995. Efforts made during the period from 1 July 1992 to 30 June 1996 led to an increase of 60 per cent in the representation of women at the D-1 level and above.

28. In the same resolution, the General Assembly reiterated its request that the Secretary-General make every effort to increase the representation of women from developing countries, in particular at the D-1 level and above.

29. The efforts to meet the requests of the General Assembly concerning women continue. As of 30 June 1996, the number of women in geographical posts was 882, or 35.1 per cent. Table 3A in annex I shows the distribution of men and women by region and level.

30. The evolution of the proportion of women in geographical posts between 30 June 1992 - when it was 30.6 per cent - and 30 June 1996 is shown in text table D. That table also shows women staff for each region as percentages of all staff (table D.1) and as percentages of women staff only (table D.2).

31. The number and percentage of women in geographical posts and in posts with special language requirements on 30 June 1986 and on 30 June 1996 are shown in text table E. The percentage of women in geographical posts has risen from 24.7 per cent to 35.1 per cent over the period. The percentage of women in language posts has moved from 33.1 per cent to 36.3 per cent over the same period.

G. Recruitment activities

Appointments to posts subject to geographical distribution during the period from 1 July 1995 to 30 June 1996

34. In resolution 45/239 A, the General Assembly urged the Secretary-General, when making appointments at all levels to posts subject to geographical distribution, to make every effort to recruit nationals of unrepresented and underrepresented Member States, bearing in mind also the need to increase the number of staff recruited from Member States below the mid-point of their desirable ranges.

35. During the reporting period (1 July 1995-30 June 1996), 129 appointments were made to posts subject to geographical distribution. 2/ Of these, 5, or 3.9 per cent, were of nationals of unrepresented Member States; 20, or 15.5 per cent, were of nationals of underrepresented Member States; 99, or 76.7 per cent, were of nationals of within-range Member States; 5, or 3.9 per cent, were of nationals of overrepresented Member States. 3/ Further details concerning the number and levels of these appointments can be found below and in table 6 in annex I to the present report.

National competitive examinations

36. Appointments to posts subject to geographical distribution during the reporting period included those of 32 candidates who were successful in national competitive examinations for posts at the P-2 and P-3 levels. They were selected through examinations held in Armenia, Botswana, Bulgaria, Dominica, Ecuador, El Salvador, Germany, Grenada, Haiti, Italy, Japan, Namibia, Pakistan, Paraguay, Portugal, the Republic of Korea, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Spain, the United States of America and Venezuela.

37. These appointments account for 24.8 per cent of all appointments to posts subject to geographical distribution during the reporting period. They included 14 women, representing 43.8 per cent of these appointments.

38. Seven women candidates were recruited at the P-2 levels outside the context of national competitive examinations.

39. Competitive examinations for posts at the P-2 and P-3 levels were also held in Belize, Estonia, Gabon, Georgia, Germany, Japan, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Mauritania, Micronesia (Federated States of), Mongolia, Paraguay, Slovenia, Spain, Suriname, Turkmenistan and Viet Nam. A number of successful candidates in these examinations are currently under recruitment.

Recruitment of women

40. Between 1 July 1995 and 30 June 1996, 55 women were appointed to posts subject to geographical distribution, representing 42.6 per cent of the 129 appointments made during the reporting period. Women from developing countries accounted for 25 appointments, that is to say, 45.5 per cent of the 55 appointments of women made during the reporting period.

Notes

1/ Member States are unrepresented when none of their nationals is in a post subject to geographical distribution; underrepresented when the number of their nationals in these posts is below the lower limit of their ranges; within range when the number of their nationals in these posts is within the limits of their ranges; and overrepresented when the number of their nationals in these posts exceeds the upper limit of their ranges.

2/ In the compilation of statistics for the present report, an appointment to a post subject to geographical distribution is understood as the granting to a staff member of an appointment for one year or more, either through initial or other recruitment involving service for at least this period; or through the completion of at least one year of service in such a post.

3/ The figures cited in this paragraph are computed on the basis of the degree of representation of each Member State at the end of the previous reporting year, on 30 June 1995, as communicated to the General Assembly in the latest report of the Secretary-General on the composition of the Secretariat (A/50/540). Although the fluctuations in the representation of Member States during the reporting year are not directly taken into account in this computation, they are estimated monthly and used in monitoring geographical distribution and in planning recruitment.
