REVIEW OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS AND DECISIONS ADOPTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY AT ITS TENTH SPECIAL SESSION: REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE ON DISARMAMENT

Poland: draft resolution

The General Assembly,

<u>Having considered</u> the report of the Conference on Disarmament, 1/2

<u>Convinced</u> that the Conference on Disarmament, as the single multilateral disarmament negotiating forum of the international community, has the primary role in substantive negotiations on priority questions of disarmament,

<u>Considering</u>, in this respect, that the present international climate should give additional impetus to multilateral negotiations with the aim of reaching concrete agreements,

<u>Welcoming</u> the conclusion of negotiations in the Conference on Disarmament on the draft comprehensive nuclear-test-ban treaty, which has reaffirmed the need for and the importance of the Conference as the single multilateral negotiating forum of the international community,

1. <u>Reaffirms</u> the role of the Conference on Disarmament as the single multilateral disarmament negotiating forum of the international community;

2. <u>Welcomes</u> the determination of the Conference on Disarmament to fulfil that role in the light of the evolving international situation, with a view to making early substantive progress on priority items of its agenda;

3. <u>Welcomes</u> the decision taken by the Conference on Disarmament on 17 June 1996 to expand its membership with the admission of 23 new members; $\underline{2}/$

4. <u>Encourages</u> the Conference on Disarmament to continue further review of its membership;

5. <u>Also encourages</u> the Conference on Disarmament to further intensify the ongoing review of its agenda and methods of work;

6. <u>Urges</u> the Conference on Disarmament to make every effort to reach a consensus on its agenda and programme of work at the beginning of its 1997 session;

7. <u>Requests</u> the Secretary-General to continue to ensure the provision to the Conference on Disarmament of adequate administrative, substantive and conference support services;

8. <u>Requests</u> the Conference on Disarmament to submit a report on its work to the General Assembly at its fifty-second session;

9. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its fifty-second session the item entitled "Report of the Conference on Disarmament".
