THE ROLE OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY IN THE CONTEXT OF INTERNATIONAL SECURITY, DISARMAMENT AND OTHER RELATED FIELDS

Austria, Bolivia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cambodia, Canada, Chile, Czech Republic, Denmark, Ecuador, Finland, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Kazakstan, Lithuania, New Zealand, Nicaragua, Norway, Poland, Republic of Moldova, Romania, South Africa and Sweden: draft resolution

The General Assembly,

Recalling its previous resolutions on the subject of the role of science and technology in the context of international security, disarmament and other related fields, in which, <u>inter alia</u>, it recognized that scientific and technological developments could have both civilian and military applications and that progress in science and technology for civilian applications needed to be maintained and encouraged,

- 1. <u>Invites</u> Member States to enhance bilateral and multilateral dialogue on the role of science and technology in the context of international security, disarmament and other related fields, with a view to:
- (a) Ensuring implementation of relevant commitments already undertaken under international legal instruments;
- (b) Exploring ways and means of further developing international legal rules on transfers of high technology with military applications;
- 2. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its fifty-third session the item entitled "The role of science and technology in the context of international security, disarmament and other related fields".
