PROGRAMME BUDGET FOR THE BIENNIUM 1996-1997

PATTERN OF CONFERENCES

Meetings additional to the approved calendar of conferences and meetings for the biennium 1996-1997

Note by the Secretariat

1. In the course of this year, numerous intergovernmental bodies have requested to convene in 1997 meetings additional to those scheduled in the calendar of conferences and meetings for the biennium 1996-1997, 1/ as approved by the General Assembly in paragraph 2 of its resolution 50/206 A of 23 December 1995.
2. In his letter dated 9 May 1996 (A/C.5/50/66), the Chairman of the Committee on Conferences, expressing the views of that Committee concerning the impact of the Secretary-General's report on the proposed programme budget for the biennium 1996-1997 (A/C.5/50/57), informed the Chairman of the Fifth Committee that:
"Even after taking into account the capacity expected to be released
by the cancellation of scheduled meetings, available resources would
be sufficient to service only those meetings approved in the calendar
of conferences, and no additional meetings requested by any
intergovernmental organ could be accommodated without additional
resources."
3. In paragraph 25 of its report to the General Assembly, 2/ the Committee on Conferences recommended that the Assembly should consider the budgetary impact of any meetings added to the calendar of conferences and meetings for the biennium, as adopted by the General Assembly in 1995, taking into account the aforementioned letter.
4. In the light of the foregoing, the annex to the present note contains a current listing of bodies that have requested additional meetings with conference services in 1997. Next to the requested date, an indication is given as to whether the meeting can be accommodated; otherwise, possible alternative dates for doing so are suggested. As to additional meetings now being discussed in the Main Committees of the General Assembly, the present document could be amended and relevant addenda issued as and when appropriate.
5. The possibility of accommodating a given meeting is based on the resources available, as indicated in document A/C.5/50/57/Add.1, including both permanent resources and a certain level of temporary resources. Any additional demands over and above those levels cannot be met. It is not possible to offset such over-expenditure under section 26 E by under-expenditure in another section of the budget, as all budgeted sections have been subjected to economy measures required to contain expenditure within the provisions appropriated by the General Assembly in its resolution 50/214 of 23 December 1995.
6. It should be noted that with four exceptions (the Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination against Women and its pre-sessional Working Group, the Fifth Committee, the Assembly of the International Seabed Authority and the Conference of Parties to the Convention on Desertification, meetings of the Conference of the Parties and subsidiary bodies), the meetings in question have already been included in the draft revised calendar of conferences and meetings for 1997 annexed to the report of the Committee on Conferences. 2/ In each case, a footnote highlights the recommendation referred to in paragraph 3 above. It should also be noted, taking into account the Organization's available resources, that additional meetings of any body, including those of the Main Committees of the General Assembly, can no longer be accommodated routinely, notwithstanding past practice. In fact, all requests for additional meetings must be considered in the light of the available capacity on the dates requested.
7. As indicated in the annex to the present report, the following meetings cannot be accommodated:
(a) Commission on Sustainable Development, Ad Hoc Intergovernmental Panel on Forests, 20 parallel meetings;
(b) Commission on the Status of Women, in-session open-ended working group on the elaboration of a draft optional protocol to the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women, 10 meetings parallel to the Commission;
(c) Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice, 12 parallel
meetings.
8. The following meetings can only be accommodated if they are held on the dates indicated below:
(a) Committee on Contributions, one-week extension, 27 May-20 June;
(b) Ad Hoc Committee on the Indian Ocean, 30 June-3 July;
(c) Special Committee on the Charter of the United Nations and on the Strengthening of the Role of the Organization, 11-21 February;
(d) Fifth Committee, resumed session, to be held either 24 March-4 April, 28 April-2 May, $12-30$ May, 30 June-3 July, 14 July-15 August or 25 August12 September.
9. The following meetings can be accommodated on the understanding that there will be no parallel meetings of the working groups of the General Assembly:
(a) Open-ended Working Group on the Strengthening of the United Nations System;
(b) Open-ended Working Group on the question of equitable representation on and increase in the membership of the Security Council and other matters related to the Security Council;
(c) Ad Hoc Open-ended Working Group on an Agenda for Development;
(d) Open-ended Working Group on the Financial Situation of the United Nations.
10. The General Assembly may therefore wish:
(a) To take note of the meetings that cannot be accommodated and those meetings that can be accommodated only on certain dates or on the understanding that there will be no parallel meetings with other working groups;
(b) To reflect this situation in the calendar of conferences for 1997;
(c) To inform the bodies concerned.

Should the Assembly wish to modify the selection of meetings that can be accommodated, it should be noted that, given the finite conference-servicing resources available, this would require the identification of other meetings on the calendar of conferences to be dispensed with.
