LETTER DATED 1 DECEMBER 1978 FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED NATIONS COUNCIL FOR NAMIBIA ADDRESSED TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE SECURITY COUNCIL

I have the honour to refer to the request of the Chairman of the African Group that you convene a meeting of the Security Council on Monday, 4 December 1978, to consider the report of the Secretary-General in pursuance of Security Council resolution 439 (1978) on the question of Namibia.

In my capacity as President of the United Nations Council for Namibia I would like to support strongly the request of the Chairman of the African Group in light of the frontal challenge of South Africa to Security Council resolutions 385 (1976), 431 (1978), 435 (1978) and 439 (1978), which have established the framework for an internationally acceptable settlement of the question of Namibia.

The gravity of the situation resulting from the decision of the Government of South Africa to carry out the bogus arrangements under the pretense of electing representatives of the Namibian people makes it imperative that the Security Council meet on Monday, 4 December 1978.
