NOTE VERBALE DATED 2 OCTOBER 1978 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE
OF DENMARK TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of Denmark to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to refer to the Secretary-General's note PO 230 SOAF (2-2-5) dated 18 May 1978, requesting information for transmittal to the Security Council Committee established by resolution 421 (1977) on the measures taken by the Danish Government to implement the provisions of paragraph 3 of Security Council resolution 418 (1977), concerning a mandatory arms embargo against South Africa.

Investigations made by the Danish Government in accordance with paragraph 3 of Security Council resolution 418 (1977) have shown that the competent Danish authorities have no information on any contractual arrangements with or licences granted to South Africa relating to the manufacture and maintenance of arms, ammunition of all types and military equipment and vehicles.

The Permanent Representative of Denmark further has the honour to refer to his note of 27 February 1978 (S/12510/Add.1) whereby the Secretary-General was informed of the Royal Decree on certain measures against South Africa which, i.a., states that it shall be prohibited to grant or attempt to grant licensing arrangements to South Africa for the manufacture or maintenance of the items mentioned in Security Council resolution 418 (1977).

The Permanent Representative of Denmark has the honour to request that this note verbale be circulated as a document of the Security Council.
