NOTE VERBALE DATED 11 APRIL 1978 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF NIGERIA TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of Nigeria to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to refer to the latter's Note No. PO 230 SOAF requesting information on the measures taken by his Government in accordance with the provisions of Security Council resolution 418 (1977).

The Federal Republic of Nigeria, since its independence in 1960, has never had any relation with the racist régime in South Africa. The Government of Nigeria believes in the total isolation of South Africa in all areas.

In this regard the Federal Military Government is in the process of taking action against companies that operate in Nigeria and have dealings with South Africa. The Nigerian Government welcomes resolution 418 (1977) as a first step in the international programme of action against <u>apartheid</u>.

The Permanent Representative of Nigeria has the honour to request that this note verbale be issued as a document of the Security Council.
