SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in documents S/12520 of 9 January 1978 and S/12520/Add.17 of 11 May 1978.

During the week ending 17 June 1978, the Security Council took action on the following item:

The situation in Cyprus (see S/11185/Add.28, S/11185/Add.29, S/11185/Add.32, S/11185/Add.34, S/11185/Add.49, S/11593/Add.7, S/11593/Add.8, S/11593/Add.9, S/11593/Add.10, S/11593/Add.23, S/11593/Add.24, S/11593/Add.49, S/11935/Add.23, S/11935/Add.24, S/1269/Add.35, S/12269/Add.37 and S/12269/Add.50)

At its 2080th and 2081st meetings, held on 16 June 1978, the Security Council resumed its consideration of the question on the basis of the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Operations in Cyprus for the period 1 December 1977 to 31 May 1978 (S/12723 and Add.1).

At the 2080th meeting, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Cyprus, Greece and Turkey, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote. The Council also decided to extend an invitation, under rule 39 of the provisional rules of procedure, to Mr. Rauf Denktash, pursuant to a request from the representative of Turkey.

At the 2080th meeting, the President called attention to the text of the draft resolution (S/12739) which had been prepared in the course of consultations among the members of the Council. The Council adopted the draft resolution as resolution 430 (1978) by a vote of 14 votes in favour, none against, with no abstentions. One member (China) did not participate in the voting.

Resolution 430 (1978) reads as follows:

/...

The Security Council,

Noting the report by the Secretary-General on the United Nations Operation in Cyprus of 31 May 1978 (S/12723),

Noting also the concurrence of the parties concerned in the recommendation by the Secretary-General that the Security Council extend the stationing of the United Nations Peace-keeping Force in Cyprus for a further period of six months,

<u>Noting further</u> that the Government of Cyprus has agreed that in view of the prevailing conditions in the island it is necessary to keep the Force in Cyprus beyond 15 June 1978,

Reaffirming the provisions of resolution 186 (1964) of 4 March 1964 and other relevant resolutions,

- 1. Extends once more the stationing in Cyprus of the United Nations Peace-keeping Force established under resolution 186 (1964) for a further period ending 15 December 1978;
- 2. Requests the Secretary-General to continue his mission of good offices, to keep the Security Council informed of the progress made, and to submit a report on the implementation of this resolution by 30 November 1978.
