SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General wishes to submit hereunder the list of items of which the Security Council is currently seized, with references in parentheses to the previous summary statements that have been issued covering consideration of each item.

It will be recalled that in the interest of economy the Secretary-General reproduces only once annually the full, up-to-date list of items of which the Security Council is seized. In fulfilment of his responsibility under rule 11, an addendum to the basic list is issued weekly, making reference to those items on which further action has been taken by the Council during the week covered or indicating that there has been no change during that period.

The last full summary statement was issued on 5 January 1977 (S/12269). The last weekly addendum (S/12269/Add.52) covered developments through 31 December 1977. Since that date, that is, during the week ending 7 January 1978, the Security Council took no action on any of the items listed therein.

In the course of 1977 two items listed in the last full summary statement (S/12269) and in previous summary statements were deleted from the list, pursuant to the requests contained in letters dated 27 May 1977 from the Permanent Representatives of Italy and Yugoslavia. The Secretary-General, with the consent of the Security Council, therefore removed the following two items from the list of matters of which the Security Council is seized:

- (a) Appointment of a Governor for the Free Territory of Trieste (S/12269, item 5);
- (b) The question of the Free Territory of Trieste (S/12269, item 13).
