The Minister of External Affairs of Barbados presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour to refer to the latter's note No. PO 230 SOAF of 10 November 1977 requesting information on the measures taken by the Barbados Government in accordance with Security Council resolution 418 (1977) which calls upon member States to apply a mandatory arms embargo against South Africa, acting under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations.

The Minister of External Affairs of Barbados wishes to state that there are no arms or military equipment exported from this country to South Africa. Barbados is consequently already in compliance with the provisions of the aforementioned Security Council resolution. It may also be noted that the Government of Barbados has no intention of deviating from such policy as above and breaching the Security Council resolution.
