SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF
WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE
REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11935 of 5 January 1976 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 17 April 1976, the Security Council took action on the following item:

87. The situation in Timor (see S/11593/Add.50 and S/11593/Add.51)

The Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 1908th meeting on 12 April 1976 on the basis of the report by the Secretary-General in pursuance of Security Council resolution 384 (1975) (S/12011) and continued its consideration at the 1909th and 1910th meetings on 14 and 15 April. In the course of those meetings, the President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Australia, Guinea-Bissau, Indonesia, the Philippines, Portugal and Saudi Arabia, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

At the 1908th meeting, the Security Council decided to extend invitations under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure, as requested in (a) a letter dated 9 April (S/12043) from the representative of Indonesia, to Mr. Guilherme Maria Goncalves, Mr. Mario Carrascalao, Dr. Jose Goncalves and Mr. Joao Pedro Soares, (b) a letter dated 10 April (S/12045) from the representative of Guinea-Bissau, to Mr. Jose Ramos Horta, and (c) a letter dated 12 April (S/12047) from the representative of Mozambique, to Mr. Ken Fry. At the 1910th meeting, the Council similarly decided to extend an invitation under rule 39, as requested in a letter dated 12 April (S/12049) from the representative of Indonesia, to Mr. Rex K. M. Seydell.
