SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS  
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE  
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11935 of 5 January 1976 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 12 June 1976, the Security Council took action on the following items:

The question of the exercise by the Palestinian people of its inalienable rights

At its 1924th meeting on 9 June 1976 the Security Council included in its agenda without objection the item entitled "The question of the exercise by the Palestinian people of its inalienable rights: Report of the Committee established under General Assembly resolution 3376 (XXX) (S/12090)."

The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Cuba, Egypt, Jordan, the Syrian Arab Republic, Turkey and the United Arab Emirates, at their request, to participate in the discussion, without the right to vote. In accordance with the request contained in a letter from the Chairman of the Committee on the Exercise of the Inalienable Rights of the Palestinian People, the Council extended an invitation, under rule 39 of its provisional rules of procedure, to the representative of Senegal, Chairman of that Committee, the representative of Malta, Rapporteur, and other members of that Committee.

The President called attention to the request contained in the letter from the representatives of the Libyan Arab Republic and Pakistan that the representatives of the Palestine Liberation Organization be invited to participate in the debate. He said that that proposal was not formulated under rule 37 or rule 39 of the Security Council's provisional rules of procedure but that if it was adopted by the Council, the invitation to the Palestine Liberation Organization would confer on the latter the same rights of participation as were conferred when a Member State was invited to participate under rule 37. Following discussion, the Security Council adopted the proposal by a vote of 11 in favour to 1 against

(United States of America), with 3 abstentions (France, Italy and United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland).

The situation in Cyprus (see S/11185/Add.28, S/11185/Add.29, S/11185/Add.32, S/11185/Add.34, S/11185/Add.49, S/11593/Add.7, S/11593/Add.8, S/11593/Add.9, S/11593/Add.10, S/11593/Add.23, S/11593/Add.24 and S/11593/Add.49)

At its 1925th meeting, held on 11 June 1976, the Security Council resumed its consideration of the question on the basis of the report of the Secretary-General on the United Nations Operation in Cyprus for the period 9 December 1975 to 5 June 1976 (S/12093). The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Cyprus, Turkey and Greece, at their request, to participate in the discussion without the right to vote. The Council also decided to extend an invitation to Mr. Nail Atalay in accordance with the request contained in a letter from the representative of Turkey.
