SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11935 of 5 January 1976 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 14 August 1976, the Security Council took action on the following item:

Complaint by Greece against Turkey

By a letter dated 10 August 1976 addressed to the President of the Security Council (S/12167), the representative of Greece requested an urgent meeting of the Security Council to consider recent repeated flagrant violations by Turkey of the sovereign rights of Greece on its continental shelf in the Aegean Sea.

At its 1949th meeting on 12 August, the Security Council included the item in its agenda without objection. The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representatives of Greece and Turkey, at their request, to participate in the discussion, without the right to vote. Discussion was continued at the 1950th meeting on 13 August.
