SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS
OF WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE
STAGE REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11935 of 5 January 1976 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 21 August 1976, the Security Council took action on the following item:

Admission of new Members

By a note dated 9 August 1976 (S/12164), the Secretary-General circulated the application of the Republic of Seychelles for admission to membership in the United Nations contained in a letter dated 23 July 1976 from the President of the Republic of Seychelles addressed to the Secretary-General.

The Security Council considered the application at its 1951st and 1952nd meetings, held on 16 August 1976.

At the 1951st meeting, the President, in accordance with the provisions of rule 59 of the Council's provisional rules of procedure, and in the absence of a proposal to the contrary, referred the application of the Republic of Seychelles to the Committee on the Admission of New Members for consideration and report.

At its 1952nd meeting, the Security Council had before it the report of its Committee on the Admission of New Members (S/12177), recommending to the Security Council the adoption of a draft resolution on the application to membership of the Republic of Seychelles, which read as follows:

The Security Council,

Having examined the application of the Republic of Seychelles for admission to the United Nations (S/12164),

Recommends to the General Assembly that the Republic of Seychelles be admitted to membership in the United Nations.

The Security Council then voted on the draft resolution, which was adopted unanimously as resolution 394 (1976).
