SUMMARY STATEMENT BY THE SECRETARY-GENERAL ON MATTERS OF  
WHICH THE SECURITY COUNCIL IS SEIZED AND ON THE STAGE  
REACHED IN THEIR CONSIDERATION

Addendum

Pursuant to rule 11 of the provisional rules of procedure of the Security Council, the Secretary-General is submitting the following summary statement.

The complete list of items of which the Security Council is seized is contained in document S/11935 of 5 January 1976 and the pertinent addenda. During the week ending 4 September 1976, the Security Council took action on the following item:

The situation in Namibia (see S/8367, S/8424, S/8428, S/8438, S/8450, S/8468, S/9107, S/9373, S/9382, S/9395, S/9636, S/9898, S/10351, S/10369, S/10375, S/10377, S/10757, S/10770/Add.15, S/10770/Add.16, S/10855/Add.3, S/10855/Add.50, S/11185/Add.50, S/11593/Add.21, S/11593/Add.22 and S/11935/Add.4)

Pursuant to paragraph 12 of resolution 385 (1976), the Security Council resumed its consideration of the item at its 1954th meeting, held on 31 August 1976. The President, with the consent of the Council, invited the representative of Madagascar, in his capacity as Chairman of the African Group for the month of August, at his request to participate in the discussion without the right to vote.

As requested in a letter dated 30 August 1976 from the Acting President of the United Nations Council for Namibia, and in accordance with past practice, the President with the consent of the Council extended an invitation, under rule 39 of the provisional rules of procedure, to a delegation of the United Nations Council for Namibia.
