NOTE VERBALE DATED 11 MAY 1978 FROM THE PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF TUNISIA TO THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSED TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL

The Permanent Representative of Tunisia to the United Nations presents his compliments to the Secretary-General of the United Nations and has the honour, with reference to his note of 29 March 1978, to reaffirm that the Government of Tunisia does not maintain any diplomatic, consular, economic or other relations with the South African régime.

Being true to the principles of the Charter of the United Nations and the charter of the Organization of African Unity, Tunisia is convinced that the application of sanctions against the Pretoria régime, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter VII of the Charter, is a legal and effective means of combating the policy of <u>apartheid</u>, which constitutes a constant threat to international peace and <u>security</u>.

The Permanent Representative of Tunisia would be grateful if the Secretary-General would have the text of this note circulated as a Security Council document.
