## Letter dated 25 June 1976 from the Chargé d'affaires a.i. of the Permanent Mission of Brazil to the United Nations addressed to the Secretary-General

Upon instructions of my Government, I have the honour to express our firm endorsement of the resolution unanimously adopted by the Security Council on 19 June 1976, 1/ condemning the South African Government for its resort to massive violence against the African people, including the killing of school children and students and others opposing racial discrimination.

The Brazilian conscience was deeply shocked by the incidents in South Africa in which the lives of so many victims of <u>apartheid</u> have been lost.

I should be grateful if this communication could be circulated as a document of the General Assembly, under item 51 of the preliminary list of items to be included in the provisional agenda of the thirty-first session, and of the Security Council.
