CONSIDERATION OF THE POSSIBLE EXTENSION OF THE PERIOD
OF SIGNATURE IN ARTICLE 57 OF THE INTERNATIONAL
NATURAL RUBBER AGREEMENT, 1995

Status of signatures, provisional applications, ratifications, acceptances
and approvals of the International Natural Rubber Agreement, 1995

Note by the UNCTAD secretariat

1. The International Natural Rubber Agreement, 1995 was established by the United Nations Conference on Natural Rubber, 1994 on 17 February 1995 at Geneva. In accordance with its article 57, the Agreement was open for signature at United Nations Headquarters, from 3 April to 28 December 1995, inclusive, by the Governments invited to the United Nations Conference on Natural Rubber, 1994.

2. Article 61 of the Agreement states that it shall enter into force definitively on 29 December 1995 or on any date thereafter, if by that date Governments accounting for at least 80 per cent of net exports as set out in annex A to the Agreement, and Governments accounting for at least 80 per cent of net imports as set out in annex B to the Agreement, have deposited their instruments of ratification, acceptance, approval or accession, or have assumed full financial commitment to the Agreement. The Agreement provides for provisional entry into force on that date, or any date before 1 January 1997, if Governments accounting for at least 75 per cent of net exports as set out in annex A to the Agreement, and Governments accounting for at least 75 per cent of net imports as set out in annex B to the Agreement, have deposited their instruments of ratification, acceptance or approval, or have notified the depositary under paragraph 1 of article 60 that they will apply the Agreement provisionally and assume full financial commitment to the Agreement.

3. The following tables contain information on the status of signatures, provisional applications, ratifications, acceptances and approvals, and information on shares of individual exporting and importing countries in total net exports and total net imports of countries as set out in annexes A and B to the International Natural Rubber Agreement, 1995.
