RESOLUTIONS AND DECISIONS ADOPTED BY THE COUNCIL DURING ITS RESUMED FIFTY-THIRD SESSION

ECONOMIC QUESTIONS

1732 (LIII). Question of the admission of the German Democratic Republic to the Economic Commission for Europe

The Economic and Social Council,

Considering that the German Democratic Republic can actively contribute to the activities of the Economic Commission for Europe and has expressed its readiness to contribute to the important work of the Commission by accepting the responsibilities inherent in the status of members,¹

Considering that the presence of the German Democratic Republic in the Economic Commission for Europe will further the economic co-operation among the countries in that region, thus facilitating the implementation of the Commission's responsibilities,

- 1. Decides to change paragraph 7 of the terms of reference of the Economic Commission for Europe by adding the German Democratic Republic to the list of members of the Commission, on the condition that this State offers itself as a candidate and agrees to pay an equitable contribution to the budget of the United Nations, the total amount of which will be determined periodically by the General Assembly in accordance with the procedure established by the Assembly in similar cases;
- 2. Requests the Secretary-General to enter into consultations with the Government of the German Democratic Republic and to take all steps necessary to obtain the agreement between that Government and the General Assembly on the amount of the contribution which that Government will be required to make to the budget of the United Nations.

1846th plenary meeting 13 December 1972

Decisions

Report of the Trade and Development Board (Item 7)

At its 1843rd meeting, on 16 November 1972, the Council decided to transmit the report of the Trade and Development Board, covering the period from 21 September 1971 to 25 October 1972,² to the General Assembly and to draw the attention of the Assembly to the comments on the subject made in the Council at its 1843rd meeting.

Reports of the World Bank Group (Item 6)

At its 1842nd meeting, on 18 October 1972, the Council took note with appreciation of the report of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development and the International Development Association, and of the report of the International Finance Corporation ⁹

Report of the International Monetary Fund (Item 8)

At its 1845th meeting, on 17 November 1972, the Council took note with appreciation of the report of the International Monetary Fund.⁴

Question of the establishment of an economic commission for Western Asia (Item 5)

At its 1845th meeting, on 17 November 1972, the Council deferred consideration of the draft resolution submitted by Lebanon⁵ to its fifty-fifth session.

Question of the establishment of a United Nations revolving fund for natural resources exploration (Item 2)

At its 1845th meeting, on 17 November 1972, the Council deferred further consideration of the item to its fifty-fourth session.

Report of the Population Commission on its special session

(Item 4)

At its 1845th meeting, on 17 November 1972, the Council decided (a) that the Population Commission should meet at approximately six-month intervals in the period between the conclusion of its special session (August 1972) and the opening of the World Population Conference, 1974; (b) that the name of the Advisory Committee on Global Population Strategy be changed to "Advisory Committee of Experts on the World Population Plan of Action", and that, consequently, the study on global population strategy should be renamed "Study on population problems, policies and priorities: technical background to the World Population Plan of Action"; (c) to reconsider its decision (resolution 1484 (XLVIII)) regarding the participation of specialists in the Conference and to this effect endorsed the views expressed by the Population Commission in paragraphs 45 and 46 of its report⁶

on the role of specialists in the Conference; (d) that the Advisory Committee of Experts on the World Population Plan of Action should meet at least twice more, and that the number of experts on the Committee should be increased; (e) to take note of the report of the Population Commission on its special session.⁶

Modification of the World Food Programme budget cycle

(Item 11)

At its 1842nd meeting, on 18 October 1972, the Council approved the amendment proposed by the United Nations/FAO Intergovernmental Committee of the World Food Programme⁷ that the World Food Programme budget cycle should be biennial and that the first biennial period should be 1974-1975, which would coincide with the FAO biennial cycle.

SPECIAL QUESTIONS

1731 (LIII). Question of the establishment of an international university

The Economic and Social Council,

Recalling its resolution 1653 (LI) of 23 November 1971,

Recalling also General Assembly resolution 2822 (XXVI) of 16 December 1971,

Recalling further that the Executive Board of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization took a decision on this question on 27 June 1972,8 in which the Board, inter alia, reaffirmed its commendation of the proposal to establish an international university under the auspices of the United Nations and expressed its agreement with the main conclusions of studies already conducted,

Recognizing the importance and value to the world community of an autonomous international university system under the auspices of the United Nations, with the full co-operation of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization according to the guidelines set out by the Panel of Experts on the Establishment of an International University,

- 1. Takes note with appreciation of the reports of the Secretary-General9 and endorses the views and recommendations of the Secretary-General contained therein:
- 2. Recommends that the General Assembly take a decision on the establishment of an international university at its twenty-seventh session, taking into consideration the comments and observations on the subject made in the Economic and Social Council and at the seventeenth session of the General Conference of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization;
- 3. Recommends also that the General Assembly take practical steps for implementation as soon as possible, including the creation of a founding committee composed of a limited number of experts representing major academic, educational and cultural trends in the world and charged with drafting the charter of the university;
- 4. Emphasizes the need for financial support for the international university to be made available through voluntary contributions by governmental and nongovernmental sources.

1839th plenary meeting 15 September 1972

Report of the United Nations Conference on the Human Environment (Item 3)

Decision

At its 1840th meeting, on 17 October 1972, the Council took note of the report of the United Nations Conference on the Human Environment¹⁰ and the report of the Secretary-General thereon.11

- (b) At its 1845th meeting, on 17 November 1972, the Council:
- (i) Approved the proposal to convene the Ad Hoc Working Group of Experts of the Commission on Human Rights on 15 January at Geneva, instead of in New York;
- (ii) Approved the proposal that the Committee on Natural Resources (third session) should meet at New Delhi from 5 to 16 February, instead of from 12 to 23 February;
- (iii) Approved the proposal that the sessions of the Working Group of the Sub-Commission on the Prevention of Discrimination and Protection of Minorities and of the Sub-Commission itself, scheduled for Geneva from 13 to 24 August and from 27 August to 14 September, respectively, be postponed by one week;
- (iv) Approved the proposal to invite the Working Group on Oceanography and Data Exchange of the Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission to meet at United Nations Headquarters from 9 to 13 July 1973.

Election of one member of the Committee on Science and Technology for Development (Item 9)

At its 1845th meeting, on 17 November 1972, the Council elected Mongolia to the Committee on Science and Technology for Development for a term of office of three years beginning on 1 January 1973.

Election of one member of the Statistical Commission (Item 9)

At its 1845th meeting, on 17 November 1972, the Council elected SRI LANKA to the Statistical Commission for a term of office of four years beginning on 1 January 1973.

Postponement of elections (Item 9)

At its 1845th meeting, on 17 November 1972, the Council postponed until the organizational meetings of its fifty-fourth session the election of:

(a) Committee on Natural Resources

One member for a term of office of four years and one member for a term of office of two years from Western European and other States beginning on 1 January 1973;

(b) Committee on Science and Technology for Development

Five members from African States, three members from Asian States and one member from Western European and other States for a term of office of three years beginning on 1 January 1973;

(c) Committee on Review and Appraisal

Six members from African States and three members from Asian States for a term of office ending on 31 December 1973.

Consideration of the provisional agenda for the organizational meetings of the fifty-fourth session (Item 10)

At its 1845th meeting, on 17 November 1972, the Council approved its provisional agenda for the organizational meetings of the fifty-fourth session.¹²
