REVIEW OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE DECLARATION ON THE STRENGTHENING OF INTERNATIONAL SECURITY

Report of the First Committee (Part XXII)\*

#### I. INTRODUCTION

1. The First Committee considered agenda item 81 jointly with all the other items relating to disarmament and international security (for details, see A/51/566). For the documents before the Committee under item 81, see A/51/566, paragraph 3.

#### II. CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSALS

#### A. <u>Draft resolution A/C.1/51/L.42 and Rev.1</u>

- 2. At the 16th meeting of the Committee, on 6 November 1996, the representative of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia introduced a draft resolution entitled "The maintenance of international security prevention of the violent disintegration of States" (A/C.1/51/L.42). Subsequently, Austria, Belgium, the Congo, Denmark, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands and Zaire joined in sponsoring the draft resolution.
- 3. On 13 November, the Committee had before it a revised draft resolution (A/C.1/51/L.42/Rev.1) submitted by the same sponsors, and <u>Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina</u>, France, Georgia, Germany, Greece, Norway, the <u>Republic of Moldova</u>,

the <u>Russian Federation</u>, <u>Spain</u>, <u>Turkey</u>, the <u>United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland</u> and the <u>United States of America</u>, subsequently joined by <u>Albania</u>, <u>Ecuador</u> and <u>Ukraine</u>, which contained the following changes:

- (a) A new operative paragraph 4 was inserted, reading:
- "4. <u>Affirms also</u> the need for strict compliance with the principle of the territorial integrity of any State",

and the subsequent paragraphs were renumbered accordingly;

- (b) In operative paragraph 5 (former paragraph 4), after the words "relevant international", the word "governmental" was deleted.
- 4. At its 24th meeting, on 15 November, the Committee adopted draft resolution A/C.1/51/L.42/Rev.1 by a recorded vote of 137 to none, with 7 abstentions (see para. 7). The voting was as follows:

#### B. <u>Draft decision A/C.1/51/L.22</u>

- 5. At the 14th meeting, on 4 November, the representative of  $\underline{\text{Colombia}}$ , on behalf of the States Members that are members of the Movement of Non-Aligned Countries, introduced a draft decision entitled "Review of the implementation of the Declaration on the Strengthening of International Security" (A/C.1/51/L.22).
- 6. At its 24th meeting, on 15 November, the Committee adopted draft decision A/C.1/51/L.22 by a recorded vote of 95 to none, with 51 abstentions (see para. 8). The voting was as follows:

#### III. RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE FIRST COMMITTEE

7. The First Committee recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft resolution:

## The maintenance of international security - prevention of the violent disintegration of States

The General Assembly,

Recalling the purposes and principles of the Charter of the United Nations,

<u>Convinced</u> that the observance of the Charter and the principles of international law is essential for the strengthening of international peace and security,

 $\underline{\text{Considering}}$  the emergence of new opportunities for building a peaceful world,

<u>Mindful</u> of the obligations of all States under the Charter, <u>inter alia</u>, to refrain in their international relations from threat or use of force against the territorial integrity or political independence of any State, to develop friendly relations among nations and to promote and encourage respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms for all without distinction as to race, sex, language or religion,

<u>Deeply concerned</u> that situations that may lead to a breach of international peace are continuing in spite of the efforts of the United Nations to put an end to them and to avert such conflicts in the future,

Stressing the importance of the activities of the international organizations, such as the Organization of African Unity, the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe, the Organization of American States, the Association of South-East Asian Nations, the Council of Europe, the League of Arab States and the Organization of the Islamic Conference, with the aim of preventing the violent disintegration of States, of maintaining international peace and security and of promoting international cooperation for development,

 $\underline{\text{Considering}}$  that the violent disintegration of States may threaten the maintenance of international peace and security,

Affirming the need for United Nations measures to help prevent the violent disintegration of States, thereby enhancing the maintenance of international peace and security and the economic and social advancement of all peoples,

1. <u>Calls upon</u> all States, the relevant international organizations and competent organs of the United Nations to continue to undertake measures in accordance with the Charter of the United Nations as appropriate to help prevent the violent disintegration of States;

- 2. <u>Stresses</u> the importance of good-neighbourliness and the development of friendly relations among States to the solution of problems among States, to prevent the violent disintegration of States and to promote international cooperation in accordance with the Charter;
- 3. Affirms the need for strict compliance with the principle of the inviolability of international borders among States;
- 4. Affirms also the need for strict compliance with the principle of the territorial integrity of any State;
- 5. Requests all States and the relevant international organizations to communicate to the Secretary-General their views on the maintenance of international security prevention of the violent disintegration of States;
- 6. <u>Decides</u> to include in the provisional agenda of its fifty-third session an item entitled "The maintenance of international security prevention of the violent disintegration of States".

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8. The First Committee also recommends to the General Assembly the adoption of the following draft decision:

# Review of the implementation of the Declaration on the Strengthening of International Security

The General Assembly decides to include in the provisional agenda of its fifty-second session the item entitled "Review of the implementation of the Declaration on the Strengthening of International Security."

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
